PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The club went into season 2005/2006 with high expectations following the exceptional performances of our 1st grade team the previous season. The belief that we were good enough to win premierships had been instilled in 1st grade and it was hoped that some of this would rub off on the other grades. The jump from 12th last season to 5th this season in the Club Championship was evidence of this belief throughout the grades.

First grade were not able to attain the heights of the previous season. A strong finish to the season was not enough to overcome some missed opportunities earlier in the season and they finished just outside of a finals berth. There were some outstanding individual performances including Andrew Jeffrey's 800+ runs in his debut season for the club, 16 year old Sam Robson's 35 wickets (including 9 for the match on his 1st grade debut) and Tim Lang's 54 wickets. Tim's performance has been rewarded with a state contract. With Murray Creed and Tom Cooper retaining their contracts UNSW will have three players in the NSW squad for the 2006/2007 season.

It was tremendous to see our Poidevin-Gray Shield team perform so strongly and make the final. This is a competition that UNSW has struggled to do well in recent years despite seemingly strong teams on paper. All the players in the team should be commended for such a great performance, especially captain James Day who led from the front and worked hard to mould a successful team.

Three other teams (second, fifth and sixth grade) made it all the way to the semi-finals with both fifth and sixth grade taking out the minor premiership. Well done to Danny Bhandari, Peter Mitchell and Andrew Jones and their respective teams for their outstanding performances.

The Universities Womens Cricket Club (which we operate together with Sydney University) are continuing to develop and with three Australian representatives in the 1st grade team are hoping for big things next season.

Our junior club expanded to five teams this season which augers well for the development of the club. Our Green Shield and lower grade teams this season included players who have graduated from our junior ranks – a clear indication of the success of introducing the junior teams to the club.

Much of the praise for the improved performance of the club must go to Warren Smith, who in his two seasons at the club as our 1st grade coach has left an indelible mark on all players. Unfortunately, health concerns have forced Warren to curtail his coaching from next season. I am pleased that Graeme Smith (from the Illawarra, not South Africa) will be joining the club for the upcoming season. Graeme comes with high praise from Warren and has already started planning our pre-season schedule.

Of course the club would not operate without the efforts of our management committee and I would like to thank guys like Henry, Disco, Paul Serov, Jebby, Pete Richardson, Peter Maguire, David Mann, Peter Carson, Michele Dunn and Darren Sue who continue to contribute many hours to the club.

The upcoming season will be the first in which we operate under Voluntary Student Unionism. The new legislation will put considerable pressure on the UNSW Sports Association (our primary supporter). While the Sports Association is working closely with the University to develop a management system for sport at UNSW, we as a club will be reliant on sponsorship more than ever.

I am looking ahead to the upcoming season with the hope that we can build further on the success of last season and bring some premiership silverware back to UNSW.

COACHING REPORT

2005/06 was a very good season for us when you look at our 5th place Club Championship position (up from 13th last year) and only one 1st grade win out of second place in the Club Championship.

First and foremost, a big wrap for our PG runners-up led outstandingly by Jimmy Day. They were so close and could have beaten the “hormone” Hawkesbury side in the final. Though we were a talented team, we have also been talented in recent years yet hardly won a game. From this coach’s perspective most of the credit falls to Jimmy Day’s leadership – a great ability to instil pride in his players’ efforts and very astute on-field decisions ... a future 1st Grade captain for sure.

Congratulations to Pete (Mav) Mitchell and his 5th grade charges on their emphatic minor premiership (runaway winners by 13 points). Most expert observers felt that this was an enormous effort given our playing personnel from week to week – but I think it even more so displayed how competitive lower grade positions were and that it was many of our lower graders who were “fighting” in matches and training the hardest (eg Simon Crowl). A shame we couldn’t carry it through to a major premiership – plenty of “ifs and buts” (including losing Gerbs to injury for the semi) but, at the end of the day, just not quite good enough.

1st grade was disappointing after season 04/05 but probably an indication of our training dropping off in intensity (few centre wicket practices available in the end because of perceived undervaluing of this resource by the higher graders). They are a very strong side on paper and nearly stormed home into the finals. Hopefully they will all learn that “catch-up” is a hard ask and it really is worthwhile to leave nothing to chance right from the first practice.

2nds played well most of the season and were led well by Bandit. Scraping into the finals was a great effort, while beating the minor premiers (and ultimate major premiers) in the qualifying final only to be pipped by a strong Balmain side in the semi, showed that we were no fluke in being there and could easily have won.

3rds were disappointing and Captain Crewers has summed up their season well in his report.

Porno’s leadership of a very oft under strength 4th grade outfit was a further highlight for the season. What a great job in his first year in the role – a semis berth (narrowly missed, 1 win) would have been a fitting reward for his contribution to the Club.

And Green Shield was very encouraging with many young players displaying the skills and effort that we look forward to seeing more and more in the grade sides. Tim Van der Gugten, in particular, looks like he could turn into anything as an all rounder given he is only 14 years of age.

Congratulations to Tom Cooper on his U19 selections and performance as leading Australian run getter at the U19 World Cup. Also to Sammy Robson on his NSW U17 selection and on such an outstanding debut season in 1st Grade. Andrew Jeffery also proved a great acquisition for 1st grade – with better preparation a continuation of this season’s form is likely and he could be a further UNSW player added to the NSW squad (with messrs Creed, Christian, Cooper and Lang).

From a coaching perspective Warren Smith, Henry, Pete Richo and Scorch were outstanding and our facilities were, again, as good as most 1st Class cricketers could expect to utilise. The whole club (not just 1st grade) benefited from the broader input of Warren (and Scorch) and our Club Championship showing attested to this. It is hard to provide praise sufficient for Pete Richo’s contributions to practice and 1st Grade, so I will just say that he is definitely irreplaceable. My own role left a fair bit to be desired as I tended to be nothing more than an equipment marshall. I also confess to being somewhat frustrated at the approach many of us have to practice and the efforts that might be needed to do the best we can for ourselves, our teams and our club (not in that order). It is time for me to get away from that scene

and to see if we can involve other coaches who can command the respect and attention of our players.

Both myself and Warren will not be coaching in 06/07 (Warren primarily for health reasons) but Graeme Smith will be coming on board to look after the higher grade squad which is an encouraging development. Other arrangements will be in place for the coaching of the rest of the club. A huge thank you to Warren for his efforts at the Club over these last two seasons. His involvement will not have ceased completely but it will be hard to replace what he has provided in this short period of time. He will be sorely missed in the role he has performed – irreplaceable in so many ways. We wish him well in his health but look forward to involving him wherever possible in all Club matters.

We could really go places as a club if we get things right – and, in getting things right, I believe the below comments I compiled as the 05/06 coach's message (to go in the 05/06 club handbook that did not finally see publication) are a significant part of the equation –

"05/06 Coach's Message

Hopefully all members of this club realise that we have quite superior training facilities and opportunities. I don't want to dwell too much on the effort we expect players to put in at training in making the most of the luxuries we have – I have harped on about it for each of the previous 2 years I have been the Club Coach. Let's just get to practice and make the most of our valuable time. Let's get involved in all of the drills and exercises that are set up each training (particularly those Warren Smith has implemented last year and this year). Let's not just talk about it, let's get on with it.

Warren, Henry, myself, Scorch and Pete Richo are coaching staff whom are all available to ask questions of and to get involved in areas of practice each of you feel you need assistance with. Please use this resource too.

I guess the big request I have in this "Coach's Message" for all players this season and beyond is that we start to display and prove that we are thinking cricketers. This is an area we should have a natural edge over other clubs ... our players largely come from broader environments that encourage or require thought. Cricket is a thinking person's game so let's play it that way. For batsmen most of the critical thinking must occur at practices but for everyone, the big chance to show how well we think is when our teams are in the field. Thinking about field placements and what is expected from you wherever you are fielding are the obvious areas where our thinking needs to come to the fore. But it is not something that I believe we do particularly well, save for a few examples. These are critical and influential issues for sides pursuing victories – which is a key priority in grade cricket – so I would like to see us focussing on these things a lot more and I am contemplating running specific sessions to try and get people to start thinking about these things in more detail and (hopefully) more effectively.

Thinking is an individual thing ... it is something we do ourselves ... but the quality of our thinking will, virtually always, be a function of the amount and variety of ideas and information we are exposed to. I honestly believe our thinking skills are waning to a large extent because we don't spend time talking about our cricket – like we used to. Almost paradoxically (for those of us who favour alcohol), I believe we are thinking more poorly because we no longer "drink" together. The days where almost all the Club would be back at our favourite drinking holes after every Saturday (or Sunday) seem a distant memory – but they were the days when we were a smart cricketing club. I believe addressing this part of our Club dynamics will have a big impact on our on-field performances ... 1st Grade last year are a further great example of a side that socialised well together and played well together. So let's also get back to the Sam Cracknell after each Saturday (or Sunday), or to the Palace later on, and talk about our feats of that day, about our cricket and about how we can play and enjoy this great game even more the next time we participate.

And ... let's run, as a club, with the momentum 1st Grade have provided us from last year. To have our most lacklustre lower grades' year ever the same year that 1st Grade produced arguably the Club's finest performance is extremely disappointing. The Club Championship should have been up for grabs for us last year – we can't let ourselves down like that again. We are looking quite strong and if we use the superior resources we have ... and become the best "thinking" (and drinking) cricketers in Sydney ... who knows!!!!!!

Train hard and think "smart" and, this year, a lot more of us can be very directly involved in the successes and enjoyment 1st grade experienced last year."

FIRST GRADE REPORT

Season 2005-06 ended somewhat anticlimactically for the 1st grade outfit, given the previous seasons success. After making finals in both forms of the game in season 2004-05, the bees were unable to achieve our season objective of obtaining enough points to enter the 'business' end of the season (finals).

A range of factors contributed towards the side not quite performing to expectation. Important lessons have been learned from this season and this knowledge will be used as the team progresses into the coming season looking to challenge for some silverware. For the benefit of our annual report readers and astute students of the game, one such lesson has been detailed below.

During season 2005-06, opposing teams were a lot more conservative in their tactics and general approach when playing us. The obvious downside of this tactic was that results were more difficult to obtain due to opposition sides being content with leaving the hive with a draw (zero points).

However, success seems to be achieved through an ability to adapt to changing circumstances (amongst other things). As a team, we could not quite adapt to these changing scenarios quickly enough. Our points tally reflected this, as we missed a few important opportunities to secure points against lower ranked sides - particularly prior to Christmas.

Much confidence can be taken into next season from the oppositions observed change of tactics- as they are clearly now wary of our side as a force in the competition.

Several important individual achievements worthy of mention have been produced by last seasons 1st grade crop during season 2005-06, including the following:

- **Dan Christian** represented NSW in the inaugural 20/20 competition, and represented Australia in the international 6s tournament in Hong Kong;
- **Tom Cooper** represented Australia in the Under 19 World Cup in Sri Lanka;
- UNSWCC now has 3 team members with NSW state cricket contracts for season 2006-07 in **Murray Creed, Tim Lang** and **Tom Cooper**;
- UNSWCC had 6 players who represented the victorious South Eastern Sydney representative side in season 2005-06. The representatives were **Dan Christian, Andrew Neilan, Tim Lang, Murray Creed, Andrew Jeffrey** and **Tim Cox**;
- **Andrew Jeffrey's** debut season for the club, in which he amassed 847 runs including an impressive 194 against Randwick Petersham early in the season;
- **Tim Lang's** 53 wicket tally for season 2005-06 - falling just short of the 55 wicket UNSWCC 1st grade record. Strong and consistent performances in grade over the past two seasons have allowed Langy to force himself into the state squad, as mentioned above;
- **Sam Robson's** impressive debut season in 1st grade, netting 35 wickets. Sam also represented NSW at U17 level and has been selected for the NSW youth side to tour England this Australian winter;
- **Jimmy Day's** solid performances in 1st grade and exceptional performance and leadership qualities in captaining the U21 PGs side to the grand final;
- **Mitchell O'Connor** and **Tom Cooper** both scoring their maiden first grade centuries for the club.

As can be seen from the above list, some impressive individual feats have been achieved in the past year. However, it is noted that a contributing factor to these achievements has been the effectiveness of the UNSWCC 1st team 'pit crew'.

Warren Smith has handed over the coaching reins for the coming season. I would like to take this opportunity to thank him for his contributions to our side over the past two seasons. In two short years our side has been transformed from a mid/ low table finishing side of battlers to a young, strong side looking towards securing the club silverware in the coming years. Warren Smith has a lot to do with this transformation. Thanks Wazzacatch! His energy, enthusiasm, guidance and passion for the game will be missed as we aim up for another season come September time. However, we look forward to seeing him around the grounds whenever possible.

Pete Richardson has again played a vital support role for the side. Again, he has undertaken all manner of tasks to ensure that the side has all the support required to do the business on the park. Pete's work is generally behind the scenes in nature. As such, the importance of his role is occasionally overlooked and the amount of assistance he provides occasionally underestimated. Accordingly, it was great to see him awarded the managerial role for the victorious South Eastern Sydney representative side. So thanks for your assistance Pete - it is much valued and appreciated.

The third member of our managerial inner sanctum is Dr Thirsty himself, **Rod Evans**. Scorch's best work is done incognito, providing the oil that is required to keep our team moving in the right direction in the 'no fuss', humorous way that is his hallmark. My hat goes off to you Scorch for your contribution to the team and club

Kari Kewt has been a new and welcome addition to the fold and has performed a great role in scoring for the side. Kari rapidly mastered the 'willows' computer based scoring program allowing us to be provided with all manner of statistical information at the press of a button. Thank you Kari for your contribution.

Café VG is not a perpetual motion machine. It takes significant time and energy to keep it going. Accordingly, thanks are directed to **Toni Christian** and friends for their efficient running of Café VG during the 1st grade games. A smooth running and well stocked canteen left a good impression on opposition clubs and importantly, umpires. Talking of the VG, I would be remiss not to mention our resident Jack of all trades, **Jebby**. Throughout the season, he has worn hats such as player, coach, organisor, chairman of selectors, psychologist and most importantly, head curator of the VG. As mentioned previously, the VG experienced a heady rise up the ground ratings this season. Jebbys perfectionist attitude and tireless approach to his work was constantly evident last season and it was very pleasing to see the ground officially acknowledged as one of the top 5 in the competition.

Special mention must also be made of the vast amount of work **Disco** and **Henry** have put into the club over the years. Their contribution is immense and is appreciated by all.

We thank all of the abovementioned for their contribution to the 1st grade side and UNSWCC in general. As a side we look forward to the challenge of delivering some silverware to the club cabinet and playing our role in the club winning an elusive club championship in season 2006-07.

SECOND GRADE REPORT

This season really was a rollercoaster ride. From a great start to a mid season stutter, to utter despair, to a great fighting effort to reach the semi's only for heartbreak at the second last hurdle.

First of all, on behalf of the side, I would like to thank the people that contribute their time, and so much more, to the running of the club. These include Pete Richardson, Paul Serov, Disco, Jebby, Henry, Livo, and especially our scorer for the season, Alan (Wal) Reid.

Our side this year was as good a side as I have seen fielded in 2nds in my time at the club. I believe that in terms of skill and experience we were easily one of the top three sides in the competition.

What is apparent though, is that we play the game differently (and for different reasons) than other sides. For most of us, cricket is a hobby, a game that we love playing, but one that does not define who we are or what we can achieve as people. Though we are competitive and play to win, there is no sense of doom and gloom should we fail to win. Our life is generally OK no matter what the result. We are amateurs in the truest sense of the word. Contrast this to many other sides where cricket is often a potential ticket to a new and better life. Where cricket provides an opportunity to escape a more ordinary life and prove ones worth.

The result is that perhaps other sides are hungrier, more disciplined and likely to play with a sense of urgency. Ugly cricket is often the norm and a grinding 80 is so much more valued (and so much more often achieved) than a pretty to watch 45. In our side, cricket is played as a game, and because of the role it plays (and does not play) in our life, we are often prone to playing it with more aesthetic motivations.

The result is that, sometimes, we are simply not disciplined and determined enough to win games that we should win. We have been good enough to reach finals anyway, but when we get there, we realise that we want it as much as the other side, and maybe we play tensed up cricket, afraid of failing. We suddenly try to play a new style of cricket, more suited to the level we are playing and the circumstances of pressure cricket. That is to say, we suddenly feel the pressure and the potential cost of this relaxed approach to the game.

I believe that we cannot have it both ways. If we play relaxed enjoyable cricket (with the tendency to favour strokeplay rather than accumulation and rip snorters rather than line and length) we must carry this same attitude into the finals (and be prepared to accept the result). If we cannot accept this kind of result, then we must play a different, tougher and less aesthetic brand of cricket, ALL YEAR, not just in March.

I always thought we should do the latter, but now I think that you cannot change a man's reasons for playing, and that enjoyment is paramount. If we again reach the finals, we should simply back ourselves, play our shots, bowl inswinging yorkers galore, and be satisfied with it. This year, a key element was that we enjoyed ourselves off the field and this helped drive success on the field.

Overall highlights for the season were:

- clinically knocking off Sydney Uni and Gordon in the last two rounds to seal 6th spot
- a brilliant bowling performance and 9th wicket stand from Zelly and Syko to win the first semi against NDs (who we beat twice and who ultimately won the comp)
- knocking off Randwick-Petersham 1 down (with Tubby and Richo destroying them in the 1st session)
- smashing Easts (always a pleasure)

- beating Bankstown in the final over as they tried to hang on for a draw
- smashing North Sydney by 10 wkts and being back to the pub before lunch

As a side, our batting often let us down, we had some spectacular collapses (including the best three of the year across all grades).

Tim Richardson was outstanding though, a 1st grader laying waste to 2nd grade attacks all year. Despite a crippling back injury and an urge to get into the odd stoush, Tim's contribution and leadership was valuable both on and off the field. **Michael Elliott** also played some outstanding knocks and likewise was always contributing to the side. **Pablo** had some purple patches and played every game for the year, while **Mitchell Sykes** and **Mitchell Gowland** are outstanding prospects.

Our fielding definitely cost us some results. On the plus side, **Mitchell Sykes** and **Mitchell Gowland** were outstanding (with Sykesy a worthy winner of the club fielding award). **Niko** showed some class as a keeper/batsman and most importantly, is only getting better. **Stu Mackay** offered something of everything, he is a gutsy and valuable cricketer and was a worthy winner of the Barr Turn.

The bowlers were outstanding all year and drove much of our success. **Shaker** will really be missed on and off the park and **Zoomer**, **Thommo** and **Zelly** were generally too good for the opposition. **Hayers'** bowling was brilliant, like he'd never been away. I hope they all back up next season.

THIRD GRADE REPORT

Jerry Macguire was very consistent with the ball this season. His accuracy and clever variations of pace meant that the majority of batsman in this comp had great difficulty getting him off the square without taking risks, ultimately to their demise. From a personal perspective it was great to get the opportunity to play with such a great bunch of lads. I thoroughly enjoyed playing my first full season with many of you. And it was again a privilege to play alongside some I've played a lot of cricket with. Overall, I was extremely proud of our efforts, yet naturally disappointed we didn't win more games. Finally, thanks to all the players for your support over the course of the season: Whether it was helping me with the covers on game day, bringing along a case of beer or simply reminding me to take my bat out with me each match.

FOURTH GRADE REPORT

A record of 6 wins (1 outright), 2 draws, 1 tie and 6 losses in a very even 4th grade competition left 4's in 9th place at season's end just 6 points out of a play-off position. Considering that at Christmas the team languished in 17th place with just 15 points it was a stirring 2nd half of the year that saw us leap 8 spots in 6 rounds and notch more points than any other team in the competition after Christmas. From a negative viewpoint our status as the supposed "post-Christmas Champions" was nothing but an indication of the hole we had dug for ourselves during the first half of the year but from a more positive perspective it was hopefully an indication that as a team we improved with each performance and ultimately knew what we had to do to win cricket matches. With the exception of the first two games of the year, when the side felt decidedly short of a gallop, 4's were competitive in every game played and had any one of our losses or draws been turned into a win we would have been playing finals cricket. It was ultimately a shame that it took us half a season to get going however a season is played over 15 rounds and over 15 rounds we finished where we deserved to.

Speaking in general terms the team developed as the season progressed into a competitive unit by improving in all areas of the game. A poor fielding team at the start of the year we were, by recent UNSW standards, a solid enough fielding outfit by the end of the year with some smart catches and quality run outs helping us to some comprehensive wins over North Sydney, Penrith and Gordon in particular. Our overall batting was average at the season's beginning but after Christmas we were regularly notching scores of 250 plus or chasing down totals with plenty of wickets in hand. A quick skim over the bowling stats on the following pages reveals some pretty average numbers but with the exception of a complacent display against ND's in Round 12 the bowling generally stuck well to its task and in other seasons would have been much better rewarded for its generally disciplined approach. However if there was one frustratingly common theme to our cricket this year it was a lack of penetration with the ball. Along with continued work on our fielding standards re-discovering that knack for taking wickets is what will turn this grade's fortunes around next season.

Players who played 5 games or more in 4's this year were:

Nadeem Abbass: Nads returned to the Club this year after a few years in the wilderness. Nads had a consistent year as 405 runs @ 31.15 would suggest. Although he only kicked on twice to pass 50 he and Webby became a very dependable opening combination. Nads bowled a mix of offies and leggies throughout the year with his return belying the pressure he often helped create. His highlight with the ball was a match winning spell of 2/15 off 8 in a rain shortened one-dayer against Mosman. His leggies were a great option to have and with a bit of luck would have brought more wickets. As the year progressed Nads came out of his shell and produced plenty of laughs. His sweaty underwear flapping in the breeze on the fence at Sydney Uni No 2 was an unforgettable sight, as was his ability to open a bottle of premium beer with his teeth. Nads also drank a lot of Pakistani tea, made a batch of tasty sambos one week and fronted up to the 4th grade end of season BBQ with a firey marinade and some "mystery meat" which to this day no-one, including Nads, knows what it was. Pretty sure it once had 4 legs though.

Mark Appleton: Apples was the only bloke to play all 15 games in 4's this year. Apples bowled a mix of unplayables and fruit and it's only a lack of consistency that stopped him from having a much better return for the year. Had a great economy rate and with a bit of extra work is very capable of having a big year. Batted 11 for most of the year but showed glimpses of being better than that and has a \$500 bat so ambition is not a problem ... either that or he just has a lot of money. He produced a cracking direct hit run out against Sydney Uni in Round 14 and took a spectacular one handed grab at mid-on against Saints. Over the season he improved out of sight in the field. Apples didn't shut his mouth all year and like his bowling his calls sometimes lacked consistency but he rarely stopped encouraging the team. His off field work lacks consistency as well although the late season addition

of a “Mrs Apples” may have brought a bit more line and length to this department.

Hugh Backmann: Petal had a disappointing year in 4's but is a player of great potential. Found some form at the end of the season in 5's and will be better for the experience. Sometimes a nervous starter Petal just needs to get going and will peel off plenty of runs for the Club in years to come. His fielding improved markedly on last season and he read a lot of books. An enigma in every sense of the word.

Daniel Bowcock: Bowy returned to the Club after a few years plying his trade in the Central Coast competition and finished the year as the deserving winner of the 4th Grade batting award. A return of 485 runs @ 44.09 included 4 fifties and one of the most destructive centuries I have witnessed in Grade cricket. On a balmy summer's day at Harold Fraser Oval against St.George Bowy smashed 143 runs off 129 balls. His innings included 13 fours and an amazing 9 sixes. Bowy raced from 84 to 114 in just 5 balls falling one shot short of the ultimate 6 sixes in 6 balls treatment (although they weren't in the same over). It was the innings of a player much better than 4th grade and had he started the year in the form he finished it he wouldn't have spent much time in this grade. Bowy also took a couple of wickets with the ball but the less said about his attempt to bowl orthodox spin against Penrith the better!! As one of the more experienced members of the side Bowy also offered plenty of good counsel to the captain during the year and took the “biggest hangover” prize in a dead set no contest on Day 2 against Wests at Blick. With a proper pre-season and the benefit of this season Bowy still has plenty of runs in him up the grades.

Simon Cowan: Merv had a slightly interrupted year due to injury and other commitments but in the 8 games he played in 4's racked up 299 runs @ 49.83 and showed that he has a great deal of ability with the willow. Capable of playing long, disciplined innings it wouldn't be a harsh comment to say that it's only a bit of extra work on his fitness that is holding Merv back from playing higher grades. His best digs of the year were a match-winning 48* against Mosman and a patient 91* against ND's – both innings where he had to produce under pressure. Merv's bowling probably suffered due to a lack of training time but he bowled a great spell in the 1st dig of our outright against Penrith. When the ball is swinging Merv is right in his element. Don't know if he swings off the field because we didn't see too much of him!

Greg Dennis: Yet another cricketer to return to the UNSW fold after a premature retirement of sorts last year. Grog's metamorphosis into a batsman continued in earnest this year. Grog's batting is a fantastic advertisement for keeping the game simple and sticking to your strengths. His 71 against Balmain in a genuine crisis was probably the gutsiest knock of the year in 4's. Grog is getting old and doesn't generate the pace he used to with the ball yet still managed to walk away with the 4th Grade bowling award to complement his outstanding batting. 14 wickets @ 25.86 being prize-winning stuff indicates we lacked real wicket takers but when Grog was fit he bowled some great spells. His action-packed spell of 4.2-0-28-5 against Penrith was the only 5-fa taken in 4's this year. I spent plenty of Saturday car trips with Grog this year and can vouch for his sobriety on almost all of them. He really is getting old ...

Tal Fleming: The Taliban had a year he would like to forget ... and probably has. Smacked 106 against Campbelltown out at Raby in Round 4 and 65 against Saints in Round 13 but in between scored almost exclusively in Sydney's pubs and clubs rather than on the cricket field. All in all Tal had one of those years that every cricketer goes through and I know he was frustrated by it. At his best Tal is a quality player and if he wants it will produce a big season next year. Tal is also a great bloke to have around when the beers come out of the esky and I really hope we see him back next year.

Pete Harris: Slippery Pete is a die-hard St.George supporter so only good things can be said about him. Made his 4th grade debut in Round 5 and played 6 games but ultimately he'd be unsatisfied with his return in 4's. Having said that he put together a promising 36 against Wests and contributed enormously in the field with his positive talk and good catching whenever he played. Took a couple of rippers against Easts to help us to a win and was just a positive influence around the team every

time he was called upon. Spent much of the year being treated like a jilted lover and the ongoing Wednesday night drop and Friday arvo take-back routine wouldn't have been out of place on the pages of New Idea or Who Weekly!

Evan Kargas: The Bowser had a wonderful debut season with the Club. He took 10 wickets at 18.20 in 4th grade on top of a great season in 5's. He is probably entitled to feel a little aggrieved not to have played more 4's given his numbers and if his body holds up will be well placed to make a push up the grades next year. Despite a run-up that can occasionally misfire The Bowser seems to have a real knack for taking wickets and gets that little bit of extra bounce that can trouble lower grade cricketers. Puts on some of the best post-wicket celebrations going around and doesn't mind giving opposition batsmen a bit of advice. Should have taken up Grade 10 years ago!

Paul Searle: Another player who came back after a few seasons away from the game. Searly only committed to a Grade comeback late in the pre-season and as a result had a few Saturday's already locked in for other commitments but in the 9 games he played in 4's he took 23 catches and went within a whisker of breaking the Club's 4th grade keeping record. Searly made few mistakes behind the pegs this year and was a reliable keeper that always set a good standard. The stop-start nature of his year meant we didn't see the best of Searly's batting skills but he is a proven performer and will be much better for the run next year. Like Bowy, Searly offered great counsel to the captain when required and was always on song with whatever he was allocated for tea. One of the few remaining lower grade cricketers that still enjoys a tub after the game.

Alex Stuart: Like Pete Harris Big Al moved up and down between 4's and 5's every second week and never complained. Ended up being a bit of a "Mr Fix It" in the side - sometimes opening the batting, sometimes batting down the order and on a few occasions donning the gloves. Always put in 100% and never shirked the task given to him. He really is an all-round good bloke with his only failing being his love of the Wests Tigers. His season highlight was a match-winning 89 against Easts when batting at 5 in a one-dayer and this may be the batting position that suits him best. Did a pretty solid job behind the stumps as well when required and could make a fist of it if he wanted to go down that path.

Matthias Treuberg: Matty Treuberg was the club's Green Shield player of the year this year and produced some very encouraging performances with the ball in 4's. His spell of 3-25 against Balmain was one the best in 4's this year and he beat the bat a lot all year and often bowled without luck. He also has a solid technique with the bat and produced a couple of decent digs, most notably against Balmain when he put on 50 with Grog. His fielding is improving and he is still young enough to make this part of his game much better. Is definitely one of the Club's young guns and has a long career ahead of him. His father is one of the few blokes who bothered to watch us this year.

Josh Webb: This was Webby's second year at the club and no doubt will arouse the suspicions of Australia's Immigration Officers should he return again next year. Webby formed one half of a very dependable opening partnership with Nads but like his opening partner didn't convert his starts as often as he would have wanted. Racked up his first 50 of the year in Round 15 but still averaged 31.29 in 4's and if he can learn to get through the 30's and 40's will score a lot of runs. With two other spinners in the line-up most weeks Webby suffered from a lack of opportunities with the ball. No doubt he was occasionally frustrated but to his credit just put his head down and concentrated on making a difference in the field where he was our best performer. Not sure if he ever made it back to the pub or to a social event this year!!

Others to play in 4's this year were **Nigel Dornan, Simon Gerber, James Glenday, Phil Hamer, Liam Hansen, Olly Higgins, David Jebb, Pete Maguire, David Mann, Chris Morris, Matt Owers, David Ross, Lachie Taylor, Timm Van Der Gugten and Andrew Zell.** Gerbs averaged 210 in 4's and scored 132 against Wests in our tied match. Lachie Taylor bowled out of his skin in the 4 games he played for us and his effort in the outright win against Penrith was the best bowling performance of the year in

4's. Timm Van Der Guggten played 3 games and made a huge impression for a 14 year old. He looks to have a very bright future ahead of him. David Jebb played three games including one game at the helm against Bankstown when the skipper was absent – thanks Jebby.

This year was my first year captaining a side at this club and it was a privilege and an honour to do so. Much like my entire career I scored a few runs, took a few wickets, held a few catches and drank a few beers. The 71 I scored against Mosman was my highest score in Grade and rates up there as one of my most satisfying days for the Club as it also led to my first win as captain. I enjoyed the challenge of captaincy and I hope everyone who played 4's this year enjoyed themselves as well. I hope most players felt as if they were given the opportunities they wanted and played for a captain who desperately wanted to win. From a captaincy perspective I will be better for the run and I look forward to another crack at bringing an elusive lower grade Premiership to this club.

SIXTH GRADE REPORT

Well, what a season for 6th Grade. 13 wins and 3 draws in 19 games, a new batting record and a minor premiership. Most importantly, one of the most enjoyable seasons I've been involved in, with terrific camaraderie on and off the field. We ended up losing our semi-final after a bad opening session, but even in that game we fought all the way to the finish. I could not have been prouder of the team on the final day. Thanks to all for a wonderful season, in particular the following team members (a full account of each game follows for those who are interested):

Matt Garland – Garlo is a great guy to have on the team. He loves the game, loves the Uni club (father Geoff is the club's 3rd-leading wicket-taker) and always gives 100%. He was rewarded this year with his best-ever season: 24 wickets at 19 with 2 five-fors and a couple of match-winning performances, against Sydney Uni and UTS Balmain

Steve Halikas – feisty "Spinal Tap" kept the verbals up and the runs down, claiming 20 wickets for the season at 21, plus 4 catches patrolling mid-on as only he can.

Suresh Kalagara – this former Hyderabad U-19 representative had a blinding first season for the club, taking 28 wickets at 16 with 2 five-fors, and blasting 366 runs at 36 and a strike rate of 105. In a photo-finish with Nivan for player of the year.

Mayur Kulkarni – "Chili" found form through the season and played important hands with bat and ball. A matchwinning partnership with Jono Tan at Penrith and a matchwinning spell against Hawkesbury, plus 47 out of 108 in the first innings of our losing semi-final. 232 runs at 25, 7 wickets at 18 and 4 catches.

Mark Lucas – "Mustard" contributed another year of yeoman service to the club. 12 wickets at 24 in 6s (he also played a number of games in 5s) and 6 not outs in 8 innings. A great team man.

Michal Roucek – Mick injected class into the top order when he wasn't playing 5s, easing 345 runs at 43 with 3 fifties and a top score of 97. Executed 3 direct hit run-outs and was a partnership-breaker with the ball, including the wicket of the Penrith skipper in the semi-final.

Hugh Sangster – another great team man, who enjoyed a solid first season with the bat. Hugh was desperately unlucky to be 12th man for the finals as 198 runs at 25 would have secured a middle order spot in 6s in any other year. 3 catches and a run out, mainly fielding at square leg, showed his quality in the field.

Paul Serov – appearances limited before Christmas by family and work commitments, Paul nevertheless finished with 12 wickets at 25, including 5/39 vs Holroyd. The consummate clubman, he does more work behind the scenes than anyone realises.

Jonathan Tan – a very handy cricketer who would have played higher had work not limited his training appearances. Played the innings of the season in the Qualifying Final for 120*, hit 2 fifties and collected 6 wickets as well. 353 runs at 44 marked an outstanding season.

Ben Tate – "Triple T" was unstoppable when on-song. Typically tried to belt the cover off the ball and often succeeded. His 332 runs at 22 included 88 off 60 against Souths and 69 off 41 against Burwood. 8 catches, 6 as keeper and 2 in the slips – including a blinder at leg slip versus Holroyd.

Nivan Weerakkody – This team scored far more runs than any other 6th grade outfit I am aware of, averaging totals in excess of 300 in 2-day games (excluding the semi-final), and 230-plus in one-dayers. Nivan was the single biggest contributor. In his first season with UNSW, Nivan scored 566 runs in 6th Grade at the remarkable average of 70.75. He hit one century – a matchwinning 124 against UTS Balmain – and 4 fifties, including an 85, 87* and 99*. He scored runs under pressure and scored

them quickly when required. He was simply outstanding. Congratulations Nivan on a great season and a new 6th grade single-season run-scoring record.

Other notable contributors to the cause were:

Chris O'Brien – a fine young cricketer promoted to 5s after scoring runs and taking wickets, his signature shot is the lofted straight drive. Handy.

Sam Crowl – bowled his chinamen well under pressure in 4 games and was one of the top couple of fielders in the club.

Victor Jauregui – unlucky not to get more games but was always willing to do what was best for the team.

Faisal Afzal – blasted boundaries and selectors with almost equal frequency! Will be a handful if his shot selection improves.

Liam Hansen – transferred up north for work after some robust early season performances.

Marty Kaye – scored runs and kept wicket competently until concluding that the grass was greener at North Sydney.

Ben Wakim – a technically sound player whose season was truncated by school cricket commitments.

Michael Rea – a fine young bloke who trained his heart out all season and made the most of his couple of opportunities. Will contribute more in the future.

Full season review

The season began with, of all things, a 6th grade trial game – the first such fixture I can remember since

joining the lower grades in 1992. It seems the success of 1st Grade last season and a vibrant 2005 Ashes series in England had combined to attract hundreds of hopefuls to cricket and to the club. A trial was the only way we could reasonably evaluate all the new players, and select a squad of the correct size: sufficiently large to ensure we had eleven on the park each week, but sufficiently small to ensure interested players would get a game consistently.

As it turned out, giving people games was the biggest problem we had all season: in only one round was it a challenge to assemble a full side. This is very unusual for 6th Grade, given selections are always subject to unavailabilities, injuries and late withdrawals in the five teams above. Anyway, the final squad featured a mix of old names (such as Garland, Halikas, Lucas and Tate) and rather exotic new ones (such as Kalagara, Wakim and Weerakkody). Overworked new father, worker, law student and Club Secretary Serov retained his place but handed the captaincy back to Jones after 4 seasons of sterling service. The squad looked strong on paper, but as Jack Gibson (I think) observed: "Paper never won nothing."

We did win the first game, though. 6/19 off 10 from Matt Garland and 3/24 from Mark "Mustard" Lucas allowed us to defend a seemingly modest 174 in a limited-over match against the old enemy, Sydney Uni. Nivan Weerakkody contributed 49 on debut: it would not be the last time he scored runs this season, nor the last time his innings ended one run short of a milestone.

Rounds 2-4 were frustrating: a loss to a very good Gordon Colts side in a one-dayer, a controversial second-week washout against UTS Balmain and a forfeit against apparent competition easybeats Lindfield. Weerakkody featured in the Balmain game with 68 while Dr Simon Gerber contributed 59 in a rare 6th Grade cameo. Stand-out performances though were 87 against Gordon by the enigmatic Nirjon Kader and 84 by new prospect Chris O'Brien against UTS.

We were mid-table after four rounds, but that was about to change. Rounds 5 & 6 were in the "solid win" category; in Rounds 7 & 8 we lit the afterburners.

Round 5 was against North Sydney: chasing a very respectable 50-over total of 231, we did it easily. Michal Roucek raced to 86 off 65 balls with characteristically elegant on-side play, threading the ball through (or over) a field which ended up having a mid-on, square leg and two mid-wickets. At the other end, The Great Weerakkody punched the ball through cover until the target had been reached: the only problem was he was 95 not out when we passed their score. Using the "dodgy scorebook" excuse, I suggested to the opposing captain that we finish the over. This suggestion was accepted – until Nivan hit the next ball for four. They marched off, five runs behind, game over, and with Nivan stranded on 99*. Plainly he should have hit the last ball for six.

Round 6 was a two-day win over Randwick-Petersham. We set out to bat all of Day 1, and succeeded, with Hugh Sangster contributing 61, Jono Tan 42 and Phil Hamer 38 of an excellent team total of 318. Jono backed up to take 3/49 in the Randwick innings and Steve "Spinal Tap" Halikas got a couple as well, to follow up his 3/50 against Norths.

Round 7 was a crushing outright win against Holroyd-Hills. Man of the Match was Suresh Kalagara with combined figures of 9/72, including 5/19 in the first dig. Matt Garland took 5/25 to complete the first innings rout, while Paul "Sneaky" Serov claimed 5/39 to seal the outright. With the bat, Marty Kaye made 54 in what turned out to be his last innings for the club. Andrew Jones fulfilled a lifetime ambition by scoring his first century, after 25 seasons of trying.

Round 8, the last before Christmas, propelled us to the top of the table as we enjoyed a dominant one-day win over Souths. They made 8/187 off 50, with Garlo (3/34) and Spinal (a miserly 1/15 off 10) the pick of the bowlers. Then it was the Ben Tate show – he blasted 88 off 60 balls to get us within sight of the finish. Hugh Sangster (34*) and Suresh Kalagara (18 off 10) got us home inside 25 overs for a win and 2 bonus points.

After Christmas, the momentum continued. We had 5 wins, 1 washout, 1 forfeit and just one loss – by 1 wicket, on the last ball of the 50th over – taking us into the Quarter Finals:

Round 9 was a washout against the second Lindfield team.

Round 10 was a heroic win against new enemies UTS Balmain. Weerakkody scored a magnificent 124 and Kalagara a decisive 44 off 24 to get us to 9/252 off 50. Then, with Balmain 3-201 in the 44th over, stand-in captain Matt Garland picked up 4 wickets to seal a 20 run win. All four wickets were bowled. Great effort by the team, particularly as a nervous skipper was checking the results by text from his honeymoon!

Round 11 was a forfeit by Blacktown.

Round 12 was a monumental batting performance as we blasted 320 in a one-dayer off 49.4 overs. Roucek was again in superb form, with 97 off 81, while Tate chanced his arm for 69 off 41 and the rest of the team chipped in. Burwood could manage only 239 in reply, 136 of which were scored by one batter.

Round 13 was the one that got away: UNSW 233 off 47.1, Auburn 9-234 off exactly 50. Jonathan Tan made a superb 75 and Roucek another 65. Sam Crowl took 4/54 bowling under pressure at the end, but we couldn't quite force the win – dropping the no.11 in the second last over didn't help.

Round 14 was a courageous win vs Penrith. A century partnership between Jono Tan and Mayur "Chili" Kulkarni got us out of trouble at 4/84. Jono finished with 65 and Chili 61 as we compiled a respectable 277. Penrith was looking good at 3/163 in reply before last-minute recruit Arjun Khurmi took a crucial outfield catch to dismiss their skipper – Paul Serov was the bowler. Chili and Mustard finished off the tail – evidently the Penrith lads struggle with condiments – with the final score 213. Special mention in this game for Michael Rea, who chipped in 2/21 and a handy 24 on debut for the club, just reward for his constant efforts at training through the season.

Round 15 was a ridiculous game against ourselves, although a Hawkesbury team also appeared to be present. Flying along on a superb batting deck at 0/83 (volunteer opener Suresh Kalagara blasting 53 and the skipper grundling 30), we lost 6/36 and only 20 from Serov got us to 159. Hawkesbury was cruising at 2/115 when this skipper's brain melted down entirely – we were simply playing pathetic cricket. I don't know if my drinks-break rant played a part but we returned to take 8/35 and steal the game. Steve Halikas nabbed 3/32, Mayur Kulkarni 3/20 and Mustard Lucas 2/1, while both Jono Tan and Nivan Weerakkody grabbed screamers in the covers. The Great Escape.

Round 16 was a comfortable win against Randwick-Petersham. Suresh cemented his place at the top of the order with an explosive century (116 off 118 balls, 10 fours, 1 six) and Nivan continued his golden season with 87*. We made 5/260 off 50 and held them to 9/186, with a couple of run outs and wickets shared around.

Round 17, the last of the regular season, was another strong win. We restricted South Sydney Green to 8/172 off 50 (again, wickets shared around) and decided to chase two bonus points and the minor premiership by getting the runs inside 25 overs. Suresh (79 off 64), Mick Roucek (30 off 29) and special guest star Pete Harris (32 off 23) saw us home inside 24. We had momentum and the minor premiership. Now it was finals time.

Our first match, the qualifying final, was our finest hour. Or finest nine hours. Determined to bat the 96 over day against UTS Balmain, we ended up batting until halfway through Day 2, facing 148 overs and scoring 375 runs. Most batters chipped in (Tate 41, Kulkarni 32, Roucek 26, Jones 25) but the major contributions came from Nivan Weerakkody and Jono Tan. Nivan scored a classy 85, in the process breaking the 6th Grade single-season run-scoring record, which had stood for 25 years. Jono played the single best innings I've seen in 6th Grade. A masterpiece of concentration, he batted 303

minutes and 272 balls for an unbeaten century. 120 not out, 14 boundaries and one stake to Balmain's heart. With only 40-odd overs to bat, UTS called off the chase at 4/76.

Unfortunately we could not sustain this form. One bad morning and one fine opposition innings destroyed our hopes in the semi-final. Against a Penrith side we'd done well to beat in Round 14, we elected to bat on a somewhat cloudy and windy Saturday morning. A combination of the moving ball, good bowling and some injudicious shots saw us lose early wickets, to be 5 down at lunch. Only Chili Kulkarni offered resistance with 47 and we were all out 108. Penrith slumped to 4/25 but we were always chasing the game. A 168 run partnership between their skipper and a bloke named C.Dent got them out of trouble. Dent batted superbly, blocking good balls without exception but murdering anything loose. He hit 16 fours and 5 sixes in his 139, which represented two-thirds of their final total of 206.

We were 98 runs behind on first innings with just 69 overs left on the second day. Damn the torpedoes and full speed ahead! We blasted 9/189 to set them 92 to win and allow 36 overs to get them out. At 3/11 we had a chance, but again their skipper consolidated. Another mini-collapse saw them fall to 6/78 with the skipper out, but our nemesis Mr. Dent blocked resolutely for 12 overs and they finished 6/86. We lost on first innings but we fought all the way. I was very proud of the guts shown by the team. Special commendations in this game to Suresh, who bowled his heart out to take 8/77 across the two innings, including 5/26 in the second, and to Hugh Sangster, who was unlucky to be 12th man for the finals but gave up his time to field in place of the injured Serov in this game.

And a final thanks to all involved for making this such an enjoyable and successful season.

The role of Suey and Oli was made a lot easier than past seasons by the dynamics, unity of the team and the talent of all the individuals available for selection. The establishment of a core group of senior players that had previous PG experience and who had played in some of the higher grades, granted selectors with the luxury of basing the side around these individuals. However, what must be learnt in respect to PG's is that it is the younger, less experienced and lower grader that wins your side crucial games. This was continuously exemplified throughout the 05/06 season.

To reflect upon the success of the 2005/ 2006 season, individuals must be praised for their personal achievement and their inclusion in this side:

Sam Robson. Sammy was one of the younger members of the side and a member of the previous year's competitive Green Shield team. At such a young age he was by far the standout and most impressive player for the 05/06 PG season. Picked in the NSW U17 side and making his debut in the UNSW 1st grade side was a true testament to the ability and the potential of his cricketing career. Sammy opened the batting and was a key figure in the stability of the top order. However, his leg-spin undoubtedly won a few very tight matches for the UNSW side. Particular performances that

illustrate this point are the 6/28 against Penrith in the semi final, the 3/37 against Easts and the 2/13 off 10 against Blacktown. I wish him all the best for what looks like a very bright and successful future.

Josh Webb. The young Lancashire opening bat couldn't resist the temptation upon returning to the country that offers blue skies, better cricket and the love of his life. For the majority of the year, Webby opened and was quite successful in turning over the strike and allowing the side to get off to a good start. His 39 off 54 balls against North Sydney was a significant highlight of his season, as his trademark cover drive tore the heart out of the opening bowlers.

Tom Cooper. A very accomplished player who has represented NSW U17, NSW U19, NSW Colts, NSW Country (all ages), Australia U19's, UNSW 1st Grade and a NSW Rookie contract was inspirational in his conduct and performances on and off the field. His extremely aggressive and dominant batting style is portrayed in the statistics against North Sydney (70 off 62 balls) and a quick fire 70 against Mosman. These figures still prove a lack of justice to the way 'Coops' plays the game and the awe inspiring talent he possesses. His cheeky off- spin was also very valuable as it was in the 1st Grade limited overs competition. I wish him all the very best for his cricket future and I am sure that his accomplishments will be rewarded with a first class debut in the not to distant future.

Mitchell Sykes. 'Psycho', a young Warren Smith prodigy from Wagga showed some outstanding all-round talent. Predominately perceived as a left arm orthodox spinner who has gained Australian U17 honours, Psycho illustrated his potential with the bat. Also making his 1st Grade debut earlier in the year against Fairfield, (with the likes of Bollinger, Lambert and Nash) his batting at 5 proved vital in the PG's side. His exceptional fielding, his determined 50 in the final against Hawkesbury and his four wicket haul against North Sydney, illustrates that here is another valuable prospect for the club and potential representative player in later years.

Stuart McKay. The current bar turn winner and legend on and off the field had a very memorable and successful PG season. 'Stuey Mac' started the season batting at 6. His ability to turn the strike over, run impossible singles and two's and destroy any loose ball that came to him, earned him the right to open the batting. A well paid off move was illustrated in his destruction of North Sydney scoring a fantastic 92. This game also portrayed his incredible one day bowling talent as he finished the day with figures of 4/4. One of the best fielders in the club, this bloke has the potential to play a lot of 1st Grade and possibly representative cricket.

Richard Nikolovski. A genuine leader, Niko was a significant component in integrating the younger players with the senior ones. His exceptional keeping skills currently see him only a small step away from first grade, coupled with some fantastic knocks that define him as an all- round player. Niko was instrumental in some close wins, with some extraordinary catches, stumpings and valuable runs. Again, another individual who is destined to play 1st Grade cricket and perhaps attain higher honours.

Robert Dooley. The infamous barr-turn holder of 2004/2005 capped an exciting PG career off with another superb season. Although 'Hooley' missed a few games due to Uni commitments the games he played were invaluable. An opening bowler who ranks in the top 10 of all time wicket takers for PG's again proved his talent. Taking some key wickets against Mosman and Hawksbury in the Final were just some examples of the exceptional work he did on the field.

Glen Dobbie. Another state representative, 'Dobs' proved to be a key figure in the success of the PG's side. Also making his debut in 1st Grade the year before and traveling to India with the 1st Grade squad, Dobs' experience and talent with the new ball immediately put the opposition on the back foot. His consistent enthusiasm on the field coupled with his very humble nature is highly commended. Another very talented cricketer who has established himself in the UNSW top grades.

Sam Crowl. Another extremely young and talented cricketer whose outstanding fielding ability could not be ignored throughout the season. People often use the quote 'catches win matches', in the case of

Sammy Crowl this was done on numerous occasions. Taking some fantastic catches and saving at least fifteen to twenty runs a game through sheer fielding brilliance steered the side to some very close wins.

Mitchell Gowland. Mitch displayed some serious potential and ability in the few knocks he had with the PG's side. Batting at 3 and 6 his capacity to be able to take the pressure off his partner at the other end was exceptional. Another aggressive batsman in which runs came with ease through some fantastic stroke play was significant to this season's success. Mitch also is a gifted fieldsman, taking some extraordinary catches in the slip and gully region.

Timmy is a fantastic and very mature individual who has some serious potential to play representative cricket. My complete congratulations to him for a successful year by being picked and doing well in the NSW U15's, being included in the U17's squad for 06/07 and being UNSW rookie of the year.

Sammy Crichton. Another exciting young player and prospect for bigger things in future years. Sammy is a hard hitting middle order batsman that can turn the game around in a matter of a few overs. This was evident against North Sydney in which he scored a quick fire 20 off 11 balls. His talent with the bat is coupled with a unique, quick, slinging bowling action. Often perceived as the guy who bowls 'rockets' at training by 1st Graders also possesses talent far beyond his age.

David Ross, Alex Stuart Phil Hamer. The success of this season would not have occurred without the skills and qualities portrayed by these three individuals. 'Rossy' took some vital wickets against North Sydney and Blacktown, 'Stuey' scored some extremely valuable runs under extreme pressure also against Blacktown and took some superb catches in close. Phil Hamer's commitment in the field and

efforts with the bat are highly commended. I would like to thank these three individuals for their effort and skill portrayed in each of the games they played.

The future of the PG's side looks very promising. The return of over half the team illustrates the outstanding performances of each of these individuals throughout this season. Thankyou to all the people who supported us throughout the season and I wish each and every one of the players in this side the very best in their bright cricketing futures and want to say that it was an absolute honour to captain and lead such a talented and great group of individuals out on the field. I will never forget some of the courageous wins we had when our backs were to the wall nor will I forget the exceptional talent that each of you possess. A.W.GREEN SHIELD REPORT

The season had not even started when the team hit its first hurdle with coach **Rob Bennett** being summoned to Los Angeles for three months by Qantas just after selecting the talented the team. As luck would have it, **Aminul Islam** (Bully) was available to step into the breach and so commenced molding the players for a challenging series.

The first match against Sutherland at Caringbah saw UNSW dismiss the opposition for an attainable 204 with **Matthias Treuberg** the best of the bowlers taking 4/28. The bowlers and fielders could have shown more aggression to keep the score even lower, although **Timm Van Der Gugten** did manage to bring a player down ... pity it was our own **Murray Crowe** with a blistering return that bounced badly. Several UNSW batsmen got a start but none were able to capitalise and get a big score and fell short by a couple of dozen runs.

The second match vs Mosman at the VG was a happier day with UNSW once again in the field to start the match. **Timm** and **Matthias** each took a pair to set a target of 188. Uni passed the total comfortably in the end with major contributions from the young brigade of **Charlie Wakim** (52) and **Angus Robson**(42) (the youngest of the cricketing dynasty). The team was now back on track in the middle of the table with another match the next day at Parramatta, the last before the Christmas break.

Julian Mark got the call right and Uni got the chance to bat first. A steady start and at lunch on a hot day in the west we were 1/127. The break must not have suited **Julian** (68) and **Nick Bannehr** (44) as they were dismissed in the first two overs after the restart. A total of 6/217 was disappointing considering the great start and the feeling was it might not be enough. **Matthias** could not open the bowling after scoring 37 runs in the heat so Parramatta got off to a flyer and it looked like an early finish with their openers blazing away. Uni managed to slow the rate down and make life hard for the batsmen. With 25 overs left Parramatta needed 45 runs with 8 wickets in hand. Inspirational spin bowling from **Angus** (2/23 off 9 overs) and **Murray Crowe** (1/26 off 12) saw the match change dramatically. In the end it came to down to 1 ball, 1 run and 1 wicket. Unfortunately we could not stop the run and after a long day in the sun, Christmas would be spent ruing what might have been.

A new year and hopefully some better results. At home against neighbours Easts saw the VG too damp to start on time so the match was shortened. Easts got first use and Uni knew they had to take wickets early. An early dropped chance of Easts captain before he scored gave them the opportunity to post a challenging 8/231 with **Eriq Parsons** (2/21) finally getting his chance after a pre Christmas bout of mumps caused him to be a spectator for the earlier games. **Timm** (2/22) bowled the most ferocious spell we were to see all season and was unlucky not to have many more wickets on the day. Apparently bowling just short of a driving length can be considered intimidatory if the batsman ducks. Uni got off to a very slow start and before long lost wickets as well to make the chase virtually impossible. **Julian** contributed 50 before we faced getting 140 odd off 25 overs with only 5 wickets in hand. **Chris O'Brien** (44 off 34) tried to bring off an unlikely win but it was not to be and Uni fell 76 short in the end.

It would now be tough to make the semis but with Blacktown our next opponents and their performances so far we were hopeful the team could get back on course. Unfortunately the VG was unplayable on the day and without a deck of cards to keep them busy it was a full time job keeping the boys entertained through hours of waiting for the final decision to call it off. **Warren Smith** used the opportunity to get in some great fielding drills with the team.

Game 6 had Uni away to North Sydney at Tunks. After getting the call right Uni started slowly again but steadily got things moving thanks to an 85 run stand between **Nick Bannehr** (66) and **Ben Rabjohns** (27). Uni posted 202 helped by some untidy fielding from Norths, with **Hugo Harnett** sending ball after ball skywards only to see Norths spill the chances and **Chris O'Brien** sending a

couple of balls into the trees. A magnificent display of fast bowling from **Matthias** (4/19 off 11) ably supported by **Angus** (2/17), an unlucky **Eriq** (0/8 off 5) and a great fielding display led by keeper **Jonno Meagher** (2 catches, 1 stumping) sent Norths crashing out for 113. Looks like those fielding drills with Wazza paid immediate dividends. We had already determined that the team would have its season dinner after this match and after some exploration, **Jim "Jungles" Robson** had settled on the Anzac Memorial Club in North Sydney (200 metres up the road!!!) as the venue. Some time later after most of us had driven kilometres towards North Sydney and over the freeway, we found the place and celebrated the team's victory in style.

Last match of the season at Owen Earle saw us gather our passports and head west on an overcast and drizzly morning, but the weather can sometimes be different out there! It wasn't! Miserable was the only way to describe it. Bully was not available so **Dan Culhane** stepped forward to help the team but it did not look likely there would be a game at all. Somehow the umpires agreed to a slightly late start on a square that the Ian Thorpe could have trained in. This would be a good toss to win and send in the opposition. Julian should never play two-up! Sent in with wet patches crossing the pitch meant physical survival was the first priority. Losing 2/2 in the first 4 overs was not the start the team was after. Batting was tough and runs hard to come by with the ball seaming all over the place. **Timm** (70no) and **Ben** (57) showed what could be done with determination but 5 ducks in the innings brought a total of 174 which would not be enough as the pitch and square dried out. The early morning wake up to drive out to Richmond must have been too much for the boys as Hawkesbury passed it with only 4 wickets down.

The players are extremely grateful to **Rob Bennett** for his efforts in selecting the team and his constant interest throughout the series even though he was on the other side of the world, **Bully** for his advice and encouragement and **Dan Culhane** for coming all the way out to Hawkesbury in Bully's absence.

Thanks also to the parents who unselfishly took the players to games and training and prepared afternoon tea. A special thanks to **Michael Treuberg** for his assistance to the coaches at training and on match days. Many dads also assisted with the task of scoring and their help is greatly appreciated.

Two wins may not reflect the team's true abilities but with seven players from the team eligible to play again in 2006-2007, the potential is definitely there. Hopefully next season some of the Green Shield players will get a run in 5s or 6s which will see them start their path towards first grade.

UNIVERSITIES WOMEN'S CRICKET CLUB

The recently concluded 2005/2006 season has found the Universities Women's Cricket Club further down the path of success.

On the field both Second and Third Grade finished higher up the ladder than last season. Both teams won four games this season, which were three more than last season. This is significant in particular for Third Grade as their only win last season was a forfeit. First Grade on the other hand experienced two less wins than last season leaving them lower on the ladder than in their first season. Overall however the Club won four more games than in our first season and it is difficult to dispute that this does not demonstrate improvement as a club. We now have a core group of players in all teams that we can build future successes on and around.

In this our second season, the Club is starting to establish on-field leaders across the grades. Gemma Connolly did an excellent job moulding Third Grade into a team that beat the eventual premiers twice. The combination of Alex Vaughan, Wendy Maxwell and Lisa Tomlinson worked well together to provide leadership to Second Grade in the face of constantly changing line ups enforced upon them by representative duties of our First Grade players. I applaud these three for their leadership skills and commitment through out the season. Sara Hungerford's performed a tough role as acting captain of our First Grade side lacking Australian representatives. This is not an easy task yet Sara does it without complaint and has matured into one of this club's finest leaders. I have a great deal of admiration for Sara and feel that we are very privileged to have her at this Club. For Sara's talents and efforts she is the second recipient of the Anne Mitchell Shield for Club Person of the Year. Congratulations!

I must also make mention of the efforts of Lisa Sthalekar. This season she was elected UWCC Club Captain, appointed First Grade Captain and UWCC Club Coach. These duties are on top of full time job, selection in NSW and Australian sides, Captain of NSW and Vice Captain of Australia. Oh yeah and Lisa also helped bring Twilight 12's into reality. That is lot of responsibility to be placed on the shoulders of a slight gal! Despite all this responsibility Lisa has maintained a strong commitment to developing UWCC into a successful club.

Off the field we also continued to make advances with the creation of a woman's participation twilight cricket competition called Twilight 12's. The competition was held in the evenings during the first months of daylight savings at Moore Park and had a number of objectives. Firstly it provided us with an alternative for our members who aren't quite up to grade cricket, secondly we were able to provide a cricket experience to women beyond our Club who had never played cricket before and thirdly it raised some much needed funds for the club in lieu of a lack of Club sponsorship. We intend to expand this competition this summer and have recently been awarded a grant from Cricket NSW to do just that.

I have briefly made mention of our lack of sponsorship for this season just concluded. While this has put a small strain on our finances particularly with the untimely introduction of Voluntary Student Unionism (VSU) I am very pleased that the committee pulled together to hold a very successful trivia night at UNSW's Sam Cracknell Pavillion raising approximately \$900. VSU is likely to have a large effect on the funding that we receive from both universities therefore next year we must rise to the challenges of being more successful with less funding. As a result we will continue to fundraise, seek out sponsors and manage our money in prudent fashion but despite all these actions it is likely that fees will need to be raised.

This season also saw the introduction of a club website and monthly newsletter to assist the Club in communicating with our members. As with most things the first year is always the hardest to successfully implement something new but I am confident that in time we will learn to better use those

resources.

As I review the past year I can't help but look to the future. There is still so much we can achieve both on and off the field. Looking into the distance future I feel we have the potential for the Club to be competitive in the Club Championship award. To do this our teams need to be regularly competing in and winning finals. I believe that this is not beyond us and importantly it can be achieved without recruiting too many more players. I firmly believe that we have core groups of players already here at the Club and that all that is needed is that these players lift to the next level.

We have many challenges ahead of us but I will highlight the two I consider the most pressing. The first is what I refer to as the Australian Curse, while we gain so much from having three Australian players in our Club and playing for our First Grade side we lose that when they leave us for representative duties. One of the key challenges for next year must be to determine a way to overcome this 'curse'. The second challenge is one of establishing a positive, success orientated culture within this Club. We have a tendency to wait and expect others to help us out. In a batting chase, all too often we see that we look to others to make it happen. How much more could we achieve (and in half the time) if we had a culture in the club of saying "what role can I play in chasing runs" or "what can I do to make this club better"?

I would like to acknowledge the financial assistance and support of SU Sport, the UNSW Sports Association and the UNSW Cricket Club. These three organisations enable the continued existence of the UWCC. Without them we would achieve very little.

I would also like to thank this year's committee and the captains and vice captains for their commitment to the Club. Your efforts have helped to make this season a success. Lastly but by no means least, I wish to thank each and every UWCC player for choosing to represent UWCC without you we would be nothing!

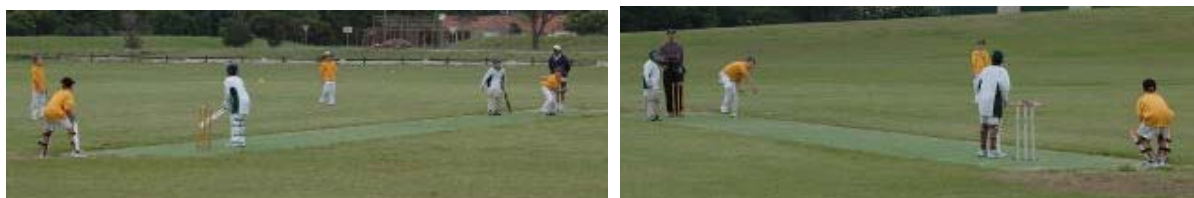
UNDER 11 BLACK
