PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I am very pleased to report that the Cricket Club's goals for Season 2000/01 were substantially achieved, both on and off the field.

On the field, we finished 6th in the Club Championship and had four out of five grades in the Finals; in fact, we slightly exceeded the specific onfield goals that had been set at the beginning of the season. Only our failure to bring home a premiership flag and First Grade being the side to miss the finals might be seen to have taken the edge off what would have otherwise generated euphoria throughout the Club.



The truth is that "the edge" was taken off our fine on-field performances when the Board of the NSW Cricket Association effectively put a number of clubs under trial throughout the season proper. There was every chance that the substantial time and effort required today to successfully run a Grade Club in Sydney could have been diverted into meetings, submissions and strategy planning sessions that were mandatory to ward off the NSWCA Board's flawed initiative and processes. The logic and process inflicted on our Club (as well as nine others) was breath-taking in its meanness, single-mindedness, superficiality and ill-considered execution. Fortunately, the executive of the Club was not so diverted, and simply lifted its own resolve and energy levels to accommodate this substantial extracurricular workload.

It would be easy to similarly hijack this report by bogging down in a lengthy criticism and reporting of these frustrating, indeed infuriating, events but I will only comment that the Sydney Grade Cricket Competition has a self-imposed problematic future if the existing environment of uncertainty, lack of transparency and honesty that has been created continues and eats away at the very fabric of a number of clubs.

In finishing 18th, our First Grade side might find little to celebrate but it is important to note the fine line between ability or performance on the field and success on the competition table. It is no secret that our batting has been thin for a couple of years and was so again this year. At one stage, with the arrival of the talented English Test player Chris Adams, and with Tim Richardson and Dave Carson playing well, things looked quite bright and we were always more than competitive. A freakish injury to Tim Richardson unfortunately knocked the stuffing out of our batting and, consequently, our hopes of a finish in the top half of the competition. We are at a stage where we need just one or two other batsman to shine through and we will then consistently post or chase scores that will give us a shot at the finals. Also, our bowling lacks a top-notch spinner but Dave Carson's development is encouraging – although it would be ideal if he could be allowed to develop as our second spinner rather than having to take on this level of responsibility at this stage.

The performances of Second Grade through to Fifth Grade speaks for itself. Admittedly, one or more premierships were a reasonable expectation, given that 4 teams made the finals and given the quality of those sides. It was probably the comparatively weaker team (on paper at least) that performed the most admirably, under David Quinlin's astute leadership.

PG are starting to look like they can produce the performances that are expected of such a talented group. This turnaround clearly has much to do with the involvement of Kerry "Skull" O'Keefe as

their coach and manager. Very generous thanks must be extended to Skull for his contribution to the PG side and, more generally, to the Club. He also played an important role with the Green Shield side in assisting Peter Hemphill and Matt Plunkett-Cole with the more technical coaching requirements of these up and coming young players. Our congratulations therefore to these three coaches on the way in which they have brought the Green Shield squad through this season. Again, we didn't achieve on- field winning performances in this competition and accordingly suffered in the Club Championship standing. But the Club's approach has always been to concentrate on the development of cricketers at this level and not to put them under the pressures of playing a substantive role in securing a Club Championship for the Club. This philosophical approach may mean that we rarely reach the Club Championship pinnacle but it is our view that it is the coaching and development of these players that is important, not instilling in them the expectations of winning and the associated pressures of Club Championship performance. The SCA seriously needs to rethink the intentions behind this level of Club cricket.

Heartiest congratulations to Rob Stark on joining an elite group of players who have taken 400 wickets for the Club. His style and action speak highly for the virtues of guile, while he has been a legendary character within the Cricket Club and a wonderful clubman. The Club counts itself extremely fortunate to have him as a member. Chris Adams also broke the First Grade batting average record for a season (72.13) and, in doing so, showed us all the talent required to play at the International level (even for England!). Dave Carson's batting and new found bowling form meant that he was a worthy winner of the Player of the Year award.

Glenn Clark and I were honoured with life memberships this year and David Jebb was a very well deserved Clubman of the Year. My personal congratulations to Glen and David. Like Rob Stark, they just don't come any finer as role models and clubmen.

As some of you may be aware, I am about to "pass on the Presidential baton" after 10 years in the role. In more recent years my hands-on involvement has, unfortunately, been limited to throwing some weight behind our battles with the SCA and NSWCA to ensure the securing of our position in the competition. Like those other club men who worked with me in a tightly-knit and focussed group, these have entailed significant personal sacrifices that I have been only too happy to contribute on behalf of such a fine and proud cricket club. When combined with our resolve in similar circumstances in 1997, we have hopefully presented viewpoints with such passion and clarity that future half-baked NSWCA initiatives will be sanity-checked at a sufficiently early stage as to quickly warrant their despatch to the boundary fence, and save Club officials from many Sydney clubs from similar extra-ordinary personal commitment, stress and offensiveness.

As importantly, I have seen many fine examples of leadership and administration within this Club come to the fore during my years as President and it would be remiss of me not to mention Glenn Clark, Jim Dixon, Andrew Jones, Matt Sanders and Christoph Vonwiller in this regard. Jeff Hargraves has done a terrific job as Club Administrator and has been a key factor in the "glue" that magically keeps this Club ticking over so smoothly and without a trace of politics. Jim Plunket-Cole, as our all-round "Club Manager" and host of Cafes DP and VG, has also been a wonderful more recent addition to the Club an addition that has not coincidently seen our overall performances improve significantly. We are a Club that is moving in the right direction and will achieve its goal of being the premier club in Sydney Grade cricket in the not too distant future. I will not be the President of the Club at that time but I will continue to proudly witness it at close quarters and feel privileged that I have been able to be so substantially involved, firstly as a player, then as an administrator, and finally as a life-long supporter.

Good luck to everyone for next season and beyond. Best wishes to the UK touring party that will be heading off within a couple of days of the AGM in another fine example of what this Club (and its culture of inclusion, enjoyment and experience) can provide to aspiring cricket talent.

COACHING REPORT

The season 2000/2001 was a very productive one, from a coaching point of view. Our goal of a top six finish in the club championship was achieved. We had four sides make the semi finals, our PG side were competitive, and our Green Shield side battled hard.

On the down side was coming up short in the semi finals, with no premierships. Add two chances from last season, and that's not a good strike rate. Maybe we have to start looking at ourselves as players, and ask ourselves, did we work as hard at the end of the season, as we did during the season. Was it enough to make the semi finals then sit back and think my job's done. Evidence suggests we may have to improve in this area, as training attendances dropped away late in the season, even though we had four sides in the semi finals.

FIRST GRADE REPORT

The year of 2000-2001 for first grade was building as a promising one. Over the past few seasons a very young side has been given valuable experience in the top grade and on the back of a tremendous year personally from Ian Salisbury the side finished higher in the competition for many a season. We managed to beat teams, which we have struggled against in recent years, and that winning feeling was becoming second nature. Therefore, as I look at the bottom line of our performance this season and see we could only manage eighteenth on the ladder, I feel somewhat disappointed that we have taken a step backwards as a team from last seasons efforts. Although there were mitigating circumstances that affected the team throughout he year, we are better than where we finished.

After setting ourselves to receive the services of Ian Salisbury again this year and finding out late that he had made the England team to tour Pakistan, it left us with a major hole to fill especially in the spin department. The prospects we managed to find to replace him became injured in pre-season and before we knew it the season was upon us and we were left with the dilemma of no full time spinner. Looking back this imbalance hurt the team in a number of games when we would have teams struggling at five down and could not finish off the tail. Having said this, I would like to highlight the performance of David Carson. He took it upon himself to improve his bowling to a standard that has added another dimension to his game. He became our fulltime spinner, and was thrown the ball on many occasions throughout the year to break that stubborn partnership or put the brakes on the run rate. This he did very successfully taking two four wicket hauls and finishing the year with 23 wickets @ 25.83. In the field he took 9 catches, which was the highest tally outside Ben Nott our keeper. His presence at the top of our batting lineup was just as important. He came second in the aggregates this year with 569 runs @ 33.47 and was the other half of great opening partnerships on many occasions, which laid sound platforms to build an innings. One innings I would like to highlight was against Western Suburbs. We were asked to follow on after a total of 51 in the first innings and were 6 for 57 in the second. West's were bowling well and it was dark, raining and the wicket lively. Dave stuck to his game plan and showed incredible concentration to keep himself out there and help our youngster Dan Christian hold his nerve. He ended up with 91 not out and we avoided an out right defeat. It was one of the gustiest innings I have seen for a long time. Dave was also bestowed the vice captaincy and provided valuable support and comment to myself throughout the year.

The other half of our opening partnership for most of the year was **Tim Richardson**. "Richo" put his hand up to open this year, and proved he could adapt to that role. He overcame a slow start to the year with a 99 against Campbelltown. From hereon he showed the class bat he is, and put together some match winning partnerships with the top order. It was building for a big finish to the season when unfortunately Richo broke his arm in our game against Bankstown. In retrospect, this was a defining moment for the team as a whole. We lost Richo for the rest of the year, which left a large hole in that opening position which we never covered. This was only Richo's second season in firsts, but I am sure he will be playing at a higher level if he continues to improve the way he has.

We were lucky enough to have the services of **Michael Slater** for 4 matches at the beginning of the season. "Slats" is great for the teams' morale and gives 100% in everything he does. His batting is a mixture of aggression and timing and he constantly puts the opposition under pressure. He scored 240 runs @ 60 and is irreplaceable. We wish him well for the Ashes tour and some of us hope to catch up for a pint.

Henry pulled another rabbit out of his hat, and we managed to gain **Chris "Grizzly" Adams** as our overseas player for the season. Grizzly is captain of Sussex and proved to be a valuable addition to the side. It did not take long for him to adapt to the Village Green's wicket with an unbeaten 109 on

debut for the club against North Sydney. He followed this up with a 100 against Eastern Suburbs and throughout the year scored 98 not out against Fairfield and a 107 not out against Northern Districts in our second innings. It was no accident that the games we won, Grizzly was heavily involved in setting or chasing the runs required. He is a very clean hitter of the ball, and again like Slats puts pressure on the bowlers as he has the ability to hit a good ball to the fence. Grizzly topped the clubs averages and the aggregates with 577 runs @ 72.13 and came second in the averages for the entire first grade competition. His knowledge of the game and new ideas were also a help to me and the team throughout the season. We wish him well for the upcoming season in England, and hope to play some more cricket with him in the future.

Todd Hoare was coming off a season that he would rather forget, but I feel he learnt a lot more than he would admit to. In the off season he put a lot of work into his game and his fittness and came out firing. He scored half centuries in both innings against Manly and a 67 against Mosman. The signs were positive that this year would be a big one. Toddy was picked in the State Colts team and was unbeaten in both innings batting well with the tail. He was captain of the PG's side that narrowly missed the semi finals. Priority one next year should be to establish himself as a 600+ runs a year bat in first grade.

After a record-breaking year in second grade last year **Alex Lamb** was in our sights to fit into first grade this year. However it was not until six rounds into the competition did "Lega" make his presence felt. He shared in an unbeaten partnership with Grizzly of 116 runs get us the points against North's. Lack of quality batting practice due to work commitments really took its toll, and the opposition bowling exploited this. Lega is renown for doing freakish things in the field, and he did not let the team down. His fielding is a captain's dream. More often than not he was the only fielder on the leg side in front of square. It is hard finding form in a losing side, and a lot of the time after Christmas, Lega was put under serious pressure just to survive and stop the wickets falling. Hopefully next year there will be less pressure and more enjoyment in scoring those big totals we know he can produce.

Rowan Hamman is another one of our young brigade that have had nearly two full seasons in first grade. He is a clean hitter of the ball and has the ability to score quickly. "Roggie" must learn more patience. He got several very good starts this year, but didn't convert these and made only one fifty this year. His innings' against Randwick and Bankstown showed the qualities that will hopefully turn him into an established first grade run getter. The ball is in your court Roggie!

Ben Nott is one of the senior members of the team and was back to his familiar role with the keeping duties. After the early season cobwebs were blown away, his glove work and enthusiasm behind the stumps was second to none. He ended the year with 27 catches, 2 stumpings and a run out. "The Ibis" had a year with the bat he would rather forget. In his defense he was put in the hot seat of opening when Richo broke his arm. This was after we had decided to bat him in the middle order to help our younger brigade.

Speaking of young, **Dan Christian** brought with him enough hormones to make us older types feel like granddads. It was Dan's first full year in the top grade, and was a great learning experience. He was selected as a member of the NSW Under 19 team, which competed in Tasmania. As the year progressed, so did Dan's game and I feel the season coming could see him establish himself as the genuine allrounder of the team. His aggression in the field was an added bonus, as he constantly created run out chances or stopped near certain boundaries. The future is bright for the youngster from the southwest.

Our most improved player this year is **Dave Langford-Smith**. "Lanky" proved by the end of the year that not only is he good enough to open the bowling and cause enough havoc to single handedly win games, he is a hard-hitting batsman that can turn games with his quick scoring. Lanky scored 209 runs @ 19.0 and captured 31 wickets @ 26.81 with 2 five-wicket hauls. Self-belief was one of the biggest hurdles Lanky had in front of him. For next season all he has to do is remember the last game in which he took a career best 6 for 89 and knocked over the last 3 batsmen when they only needed 13 runs to win, and anything could happen.

The spearhead of our attack again this year was **Dave Heysen**. His ability to bowl genuinely quick outswingers had the majority of batsmen in all sorts of trouble. He was our leading wicket taker with 32 scalps @ 24.34, which included 2 five-wicket bags. "Harpoon" made a few people take note this year, and with a big follow up year could see himself playing at a higher level. I would like to thank Harpoon for the commitment he made to pre-season training and the variety he brings to the warm-ups through out the season. A job greatly appreciated.

As with every season there are injuries and absentees. A good side relies on a squad of players from which it can pick its first eleven. **Damon Dermody, Sean Bray, Tim Cox, Danny Bhandari, Michael Elliott, Tim Buckett** and **Darren Stephen** all performed well enough in second grade to force there way into the top grade through out the year. Some played more games than others did, but all were put in the tough position of having to perform straight away in an unfamiliar team and at a higher level. One notable performance was by Tim Cox on debut in the last game of the year. He scored 70 batting at number 8 in an innings that proved a match winner.

I felt the best side available each week was chosen, and as always some players may have felt they were hard done by. I only hope this will fuel that fire beneath and spur those on with a greater resolve to wear the "bumblebee" in the top grade.

There are always people behind the scenes that put in countless volunteer hours for a club to have such a successful year. On behalf of first grade, I would like to congratulate the club as a whole for their on field performances last year and thank "Spike" and "Skull" for their coaching throughout the year. I know the first grade side felt disappointed that they could not contribute more towards the club championship table, but it was not through a lack of commitment and trying.

A sincere thank you goes to Chris Chapman, Andrew Jones, Glenn Clarke, Matt Sanders and all who were involved with the submission to the SCA for our continuing existence. Without the dedication and passion they have for this club, the SCA may well have made sure this was our last annual report.

Thanks go to Selby Mitchell and Darren Sue who shared the scoring this year. It is great to not only have scorers, but people who have a genuine passion for the game. An extra thanks to Suey who has kept the statistics up to date through the season.

Peter Richardson was the team manager this year, and did all the small things that make life playing cricket a lot easier. His analysis of the game from the other side of the fence helped immensely. I hope we will see Pete again next year.

Thank you Ray Galway and the ground staff at the Village Green who produced first class playing and training facilities throughout the year.

Thanks go to Jimmy Plunkett-Cole for the catering at Café VG and his very unbiased support. To our small but loyal band of home town supporters (i.e. The "Hoare Hill", Matty and Amy, Sterling, "Bruiser", Jules and Benny, "Snake" and The Adams Family) I am sure next year will give you more opportunity to cheer.

Lastly, to my wife who showed great patience and understanding throughout the year and like many other wives see the cricket season as a brief interruption to their marriage for seven months. Through her somewhat abstract view on cricket, she kept me from brooding too long after a loss. "Remember Waz, it's only a game!"......Wise words indeed. See you all next season.



Others who played at some stage of the season were Sohail Mohideen, Chris Britten, Alex Lamb and Matthew Haywood.





THIRD GRADE REPORT

If I had to try to sum the season up before getting into the detail I would have to say that this was a great season for 3s with us just falling short of the mark predominantly (again, in this Club) due to our inability to apply ourselves with the bat when it really matters.

There is no doubt that we had some low performances and that, with the strength of our side, we should have won the premiership. But these really are inconsequential if we can nevertheless ensure that our players are developing and learning about the game and their games...and I think that was the great part of this season. Except for a couple of older "codgers" in the side where it is arguably too late for further development in their games, I believe that the players in 3rd grade all learnt a lot from this season and have developed a positive, thoughtful and keen approach to their cricket, particularly to match day situations. There is still (and probably always will be) room for improvement in approaches to preparation for match day (ie training and mental preparation) but even there the players are developing and appreciating what they can do to improve their individual performances as well as their role within the team.

Our highlights were obviously making it to the finals by finishing 3rd in the minor premiership. Our best performance was against Randwick where we bowled, fielded and batted superbly to smash a good side that was (as later results proved) emerging as a force in 3rd grade. We also played very well against Campbelltown (Qualifying Semi), Easts, Wests, Sutherland, Gordon, North Sydney and Fairfield as well as reasonable outings against Manly, Syd Uni, Northern Districts and Mosman. We had a particularly bad batting day against Bankstown and against Sutherland in the semi, plus an all-round shocker against Balmain (which I would like to add was the game Pratty captained this year).

Each year I harp on about our batting issues right throughout the Club and, unfortunately, I must raise them again in the context of 3rd grade's performance this year (but it probably applies to all of the other sides in the Club this year as well). Pratty and Sohail played very well and consistently. But, of the top order, they were the only ones (other than Shaun Bray's "cameos" to average above 30. Chris Britten's contributions in the lower order suggest that he must be given more chances to establish himself in the top 6. Other than those players there is little more that can be said in a complimentary manner about the teams batting. I might add that this is potentially harsh on Crewers who opened the batting all year, had no luck, and played quality innings' against Bankstown, Easts and NDs.

Mark "Crewers" Leahy was arguably the biggest contributor to the team this year. As mentioned above, his batting form was only moderate (if unlucky) but his other contributions were substantial. With only the most modest amount of prompting prior to the start of the season, Crewers took on a holistic approach to his game. He spent the required time thinking about what he needed to do to improve his own game and, just as importantly, what the team needed to do to improve our team performances. His contributions and efforts in this regard were a major reason why we were able to overcome our "average" batting and still almost win the competition. From being regarded as an average fieldsman, Crewers worked hard on his slips fielding and dropped only one (hard) catch all year. His technique is now very good and his mental approach to fielding is one fundamental reason he was so successful there. With a little luck (that is owed to him) he will play more of the rest of his career above 3rd grade than with us – a loss to 3s but just desert for Crewers.

Christoph "Beetle" Vonwiller won the bowling award this year with some fine efforts with the ball and his usual lack of good fortune. Like Crewers, though, his contributions went far beyond that. He may not have applied the same approach as Crewers to his own game but he certainly helped substantially with his ideas and approaches for the team. He and Crewers formed an awesome team in that regard. Beetle is an allrounder and probably underperformed with the bat mainly through lack of opportunity. He started the season well with a crucial innings against Manly and in Rd 3 against Mosman. But things dropped away after that. Beetle can play higher grades but I believe he will only reach his full potential if his practise (both quantity and quality) is improved – something that is not always easy to manage along with a professional career.

Chris "?" Britten mainly needs a good nickname developed, a sad indictment on his team mates. Chris has only 3 years of cricket behind him now yet he more than held his own at 3rd grade level this year. He is a talented player who will do well at this club. His batting, purely through time in the middle and some guidance from Skull, has come on tremendously. His innings in the Final against quality bowlers and in the context of taking on primary responsibility for rescuing our innings in such an important game and posting a defendable score was arguably the performance of the year in 3rd Grade. It was an innings that EVERY batsman in the Club should have been around to watch because it had the hallmarks of batting that are sadly missing in many of our other talented young (and not so young) players. Chris' wicket-keeping is very good, again, for such an inexperienced keeper. This is an area that requires plenty of work and I am sure Chris has it in him to put that work in and play much higher cricket.

Andrew "Alfie" Langdon is continuing to display the hallmarks of a top quality, "attacking" spinner. Alfie's variation and ability to deceive batsmen makes him an invaluable asset in any side. He had a very slow start to the year thanks to the HSC and "schoolies" week but he slowly regathered form and played most of the year in 3s. He almost bowled us to a victory vs Sutherland in the semi-final but a wet ball and some tiredness at the end of a long spell (captain's mistake) meant he just couldn't quite get us there. Alfie's batting has potential as does his fielding although both need plenty of work (particularly some "caught & bowled" practise. Alfie can clearly go places as a cricketer – the UK tour might help him develop well – and improving his ability to put some more "work" on the ball will be a key aspect of his development.

Tony "Jatz" Pratt was our all round player of the year, which was not unexpected as he was playing competitively in 1s only 2 seasons ago. For an old man his fielding is still of a quality that test players aspire to and his batting was very, very good throughout the season (although a big score in the semi would have been nice). He was also our main spinner all year and did a great job to tighten things up when required but was also our leading wicket taker. 3rd grade clearly benefited this year from having a player of this quality, experience and personality in the side.

Sohail "Sohy" Mohideen (another non-nickname – my preference is "Che") played way too many games in 3s for a player of his ability. His brief sojourn up to 2s reaped some rewards but he came back to us with the return of injured players and the arrival of "Grizz" Adams in 1s. Sohail contributed much with his batting and fielding (as usual) but was another major contributor in the oft neglected area of putting some thought into your own, and the team's, game. Always a great player to have in the side – hopefully he'll one day turn his mind to captaincy as he will undoubtedly make a quality skipper.

Matthew "the Turk" Hayward is back from the Quokka land and fatter than ever – being a simple reason for his prolonged stay in 3s. Again, having a player of this calibre in 3s highlights further the disappointing failure of the 3rd Grade side in not bringing home the Flag. The skipper must admit quite publicly that Mathew was substantially under-bowled and that better use of Mathew in this regard may have seen ultimately more successful achievements by the team. Unless Mathew is seeking to live out his cricketing life in the lower grades, 3s are unlikely to see him again for some time. As always it was a pleasure for me (and I am sure the rest of the team) to have him in the side – not only a quality player but a quality team man.

Greg "Groggles" Dennis bowled superbly in the second half of the season. Always seeming to be a little slow to get into the season, Groggles makes it difficult on himself to immediately stake his spot in a higher grade where his abilities should place him. At times he bowled with genuine pace (particularly his final spell against Bankstown where none were comfortable against him – including Kevin Roberts) and he took plenty of crucial wickets for us. Unfortunately his opening spells are not his best and his lack of confidence in using a new ball are limiting his chances to pick up big hauls. His batting is better than the 9, 10 or 11 position he had to fill in such a strong team and his fielding is good, though with room for improvement (his slip fielding form may auger well for a new role as well).

Daniel "Bowy" Bowcock also has an uninspiring and un-UNSWCC like nickname...perhaps explaining his uninspiring batting this year. Picked up (I think) his first grade wicket this year and

can claim that it is a 1st Class player (Kevin Roberts doing the right thing by us in a farcical end to a hard fought game against Bankstown). But, unfortunately, Bowie's batting was way down on prior years such that he in fact was dropped to 4s for the finals – one of the hardest decisions I have ever had to make as Bowie has been the single biggest contributor to the 3rd grade outfit in the 3 years I have captained them. Bowie may not be around for a while as the UK has beckoned, but hopefully he will join us again if, or when, he returns.

Steve "Tex" Norbury had a disrupted cricket season as he ventured off for what must have been an amazing trek around South America. He played some good innings for 3s this year but his mind was clearly not as focussed on cricket as we are used to seeing from Tex.. Like Bowie, Tex suffered being dropped for the finals but he is a higher grade player and hopefully he'll get back there in the near future.

Mick "Porno" Mag is slowly getting back to the form that saw him doing well in 2s only a couple of seasons ago. As Ashley Mallet observed, Porno has all the attributes that a top line spinner needs – it is simply a matter of regaining some long lost confidence and I am sure Porno will "be back". His new role as Sledge editor may inspire him – I hope so. Porno's batting has the potential to see him holding down a top 6 spot on a regular basis. I believe that is certainly one of the goals he should set himself.

Peter "Pablo" Carson is a bit of a cricketing enigma (did I say that last year as well....and the year before?). Unfortunately he had no luck with the bat early in the season and, combined with his continuingly inexplicable lack of form with the ball out in the middle, he spent most of the year in 4s. Pablo is a very good player who probably needs closer coaching and specific direction with his cricket in order to get back up the grades. Maybe if he scores a few hundreds he will enable his sides to always post scores that enable him to get a good chance to also have a workout with the ball as well.

Others who turned out for 3s on anywhere between 1 and 3 occasions were Tim Buckett and Hamish Nott (as "cameos" in the finals), Chris Thomas, Marc Poulos, Chris Camarsh, Talaesen Fleming, Shaun Bray, Tim Cox, Paul Searle, Eric Zehner, Mark Mullen, Graeme Meredith and Russell Thomas. Thanks to all of them for the valuable contributions they made to our successful year.



FIFTH GRADE REPORT

The 2000/01 season was an extremely successful one for 5th grade. An achievement of which all members of the 5th grade side can feel particularly proud in a competition comprising twenty teams and having lost 2 games from 16 played. However a commitment by all to dig in and at least give us a score to bowl at enabled us to scramble our way to 180 and then knock over the opposition for 150. In this game I will always remember Ruch batting for an hour without attempting his obligatory "dirty filthy" slog to grind out 20 as part of the team effort. Then having been repeatedly bounced by one of the young quicks he announced that the next one would go. Needless to say the bowler duly obliged with Ruch trooping off the ground with a nasty gash to the cheek only to later to return swathed in bandages to resume battle.

During the season its fair to say all who played made a significant contribution at some stage to the sides overall performance, and anybody who has been involved with 5th grade cricket will know this constitutes a large body of players. One of my main hopes from the season is that all those who participated will take something away from the season that will contribute to them succeeding in higher grades in the seasons ahead.

Scored a century and made a critical 60 in the semi-final. I can report that his period of rehabilitation in 5's is complete and he is ready to resume playing higher grades.

Greg Leahy

In his first season with the club was one of our most consistent batsmen after being promoted from 6th grade in round 5. Possessing a fine temperament, Greg works his way into an innings with an ever increasing expansive game. Needs to eradicate the gully grundle from his game but I fear it is more a function of genetics having watched his brother attempt to perfect this shot for the better part of a decade.

Peter Hemphill

What a team man and clubman. Despite never having a defined roll within the team and enduring a roller coaster journey between 4's,5's and 6's he always approached each game with total enthusiasm. Scored a great 85 against Easts with this success being thoroughly deserved for the efforts put in. Will continue to improve in the future years.

Brendan McManus

Season was greatly interrupted by study but showed enough during the games he played to suggest he would do well in the coming seasons. Particularly when he realises that all balls that pitch in his half of the wicket do not have to be smashed to the cover boundary. Excellent fieldsman.

Lachlan Taylor

All I can say is what is a bowler who bowls outswing at your pace doing playing 5^{th} grade. Was the outstanding bowler in the 5^{th} grade competition from what I witnessed. Should ensure that he gets to pre-season practice and sets his sights on making 3^{rd} grade from where he can develop his game and realise his full potential.

Stephen "Mickey" Debello

Mickey may have lost a little pace since when we played together in the mid 80's but has lost none of his enthusiasm for the game. Bowled an excellent line and length all season, always gave 100% and provided an excellent example to the younger players on how to play the game. His contributions to the team's success were critical.

Gerran Clowes

Bowled some excellent spells throughout the second half of the season, after a late start. Was a revelation has a first slipper, a rare commodity in 5th grade and showed real potential as a batsman. Needs to convince himself that he can bat as I believe he has considerable unfulfilled potential in this area of his game.

Mark Hadfield

Mark came down to 5's in the later part of the season. Whilst he continued to have difficulty gaining consistency with his bowling technique, he bowled some excellent spells at good pace. Will be rewarded if he continues to work at his game.

Robert Stark

The old warhorse continues to be a highly competitive performer whose understanding of his own game and how to work batsman out saw him past 400 grade wickets for the club during the season. His spell of bowling to Elbourne during the semi-final against Sydney Uni was nothing short of outstanding. Many of the higher grade bowlers would learn a lot by watching Starky work a batsman out and bowl to a plan.

Perhaps the scariest thing for me was turning up to Punchbowl Oval this year with Starky and Mickey D in the team. My mind wandered back to 1984/85 when we three were playing against a young hormone by the name Dean Waugh in 3rd grade. At times I thought a saw slick Nick Pratten standing over the stumps with Leon Darmody standing in the slips arms folded and Johny Sackett gracing the covers. Then I looked up and saw Starky pursuing a ball and the reality of the age soon returned.

Mention should also be made of the contributions of Peter Mitchell, Tallison Flemming and Pete Carson's during the finals. What a tough and focused cricketer Tallison is making it hard to believe he does not regularly succeed at the higher grades. And special mention should be made of the outstanding innings played by Sandeep Chandra in the preliminary final, scoring 195 and only just failing to carry his bat throughout the innings.

What sets this club apart from almost all other clubs was again reinforced when Mark Mullen and Matt Hayward made themselves available to play 5th grade when unavailable to play higher grades. Finally I would like to thank all those who played 5th grade for what was personally an extremely rewarding experience. Perhaps the most pleasing aspect being that every Saturday morning I awoke thoroughly excited by the prospect of playing cricket, even when it meant commuting from Brisbane to do so.

In closing I would like to wish all the 5th grade players the best for the future and the UNSWCC as a whole. I will always look fondly upon the club for providing me with the opportunity to play grade cricket and know that I leave the club having taken more than I put in, something I hope to rectify in the future.

SIXTH GRADE REPORT

Yet another season was upon us and yet another enjoyable season was complete. 7TH GRADE REPORT

2000/01 BOONIES REPORT - AYER'S ROCK OR BUST

For the Uni Boonies, the season 2000/01 brought with it some fairly wholesale changes. A new skipper, a vastly different squad and some new batting gloves were just a few of the alterations to the side of the previous two years. At the end of the season perhaps the most noticeable change was the fact that, for the first time in history, the side did not make the semi-finals. But to focus on this observation alone would be to ignore the textures and subtle nuances of another fantastic season for the world's favourite cricket team. Once again the Boonies showed that cricket isn't about scoring runs and taking wickets, it's about digging in and doing the hard yards using only limited abilities and sub-standard technique.

Captaining the Boonies for the first time this season was Big Toddy Payne (hereafter "BTP"). When you've lost a few players and are down on your luck, BTP's the type of guy you want out in front. Faced with a squad lacking past Boonie greats such as Matty Roberts, Damien Taylor, Will Keen and Mick Conn, BTP assembled a bunch of guys who made up for in spirit what they lacked in class. His leadership, patience and perseverance through the season are to be commended. Even more remarkable was the way he lead with the new ball. The figures speak for themselves – 32 wickets at 13.72 with best figures of 7/28. BTP has now taken 116 wickets for the Boonies in three seasons.

Leading the way with the bat this year were Tim "Sippa" Davis and Jock Haynes. These two bolstered a depleted middle order and held together many Boonie innings during the season. Jock compiled 213 runs at 35.5 while Sippa bagged 247 at 22.5.

Mention should also be made of one of the true characters of the game and Boonie stalwart, Conrad Strahorn. Despite only five appearances in the terry towelling this year, Rookie again delivered with the bat and the ball. 118 runs at 23.6 and 11 wickets at 15.2 indicate something of the skill of the man. A further telling statistic is the number of catches he dropped in slips. Conrad has now dropped a total of seven slips catches for the club, taking a grand total of none in the process. Future captains of the Boonies would be well advised never to place him in the cordon, no matter how unfit he claims to be.

A further exciting aspect of the Boonies' season 2000/01 was the inaugural selection of one of our number for the NSW side. At the start of the season Dan Horsley was an injured Western Suburbs first grader who had constantly been overlooked by the state selectors. Enter the Boonies. After one appearance in the Boonies slips cordon, where he filled in for a hungover Jock Haynes, Danno was elevated to first class cricket. Congratulations go not only to him but to the Boonies selectors for showing foresight seemingly lacking in the upper echelons of the game. Current club first graders take note – if you think you are being shafted by John Benaud and the boys, maybe your playing in the wrong grade.

Congratulations must also go to Jim Dixon, who was this year's inductee into the Uni Boonies Hall of Fame, where he joins last season's inaugural member, Michael Slater. It Is not possible to sufficiently describe the contribution the King (aka "Disco") has made to the cricket club, the rugby

club, the Boonies and the Australian way of life in general over the last 60 years. Our thanks and applause go out to him.

Finally, to the most impressive part of the Boonies year. New players. The phrase "rebuilding year" is perhaps too often used in the world of sport, but no other cliché is more applicable in this situation. In such a time new blood is crucial. This year we saw the likes of Steve Foster, Barney Miller, Craig Kendall, Billy Bloodnut and Marcus Carmont break through and impress for the Boonies. It is even more encouraging to see the leadership aspirations from among these ranks. With further selective recruitment over the rugby/off season, the future of the Boonies is as solid as the great man himself.


CAREER STATISTICS

The career statistics provided are limited to the details of those players who have achieved designated milestones in runs, wickets or dismissals.


