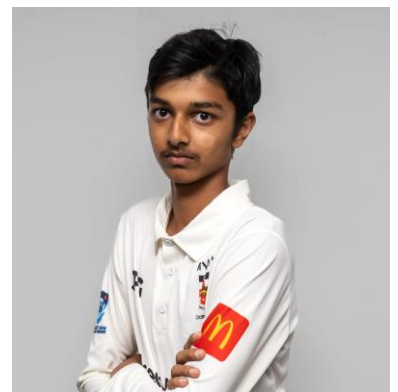

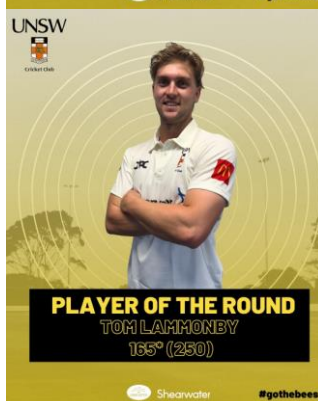
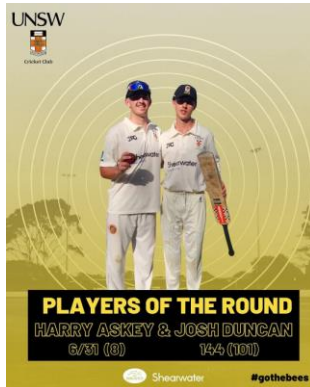

In our 75th year we felt it important to have some significant Life Membership awards. Awarding those that have provided long term commitment, both on & off the field. So tonight, at our 75th anniversary we have selected two very worthy new Life Members, Peter Scolari and Mike Gregg.

Peter & Mike's story is very similar. A long-term playing career, coupled with contribution during their playing days, but an immense contribution over many years post their playing time.

Over the last 10 to 20 years the workload and effort to run a sporting club in Sydney has continued to

increase substantially. Coupled with the loss of our grounds (the VG & DP North) has only increased the drain on time and financial resources of our club.

Both awards tonight recognize longevity and commitment to our club, but also, it's very survival. Accolades awarded to two outstanding club men. First, it is my great honor to propose Peter "Springa" Scolari as a Life member.

Springa started with UNSWCC in 1982/1983 season as a noted GPS Player from St Joseph's College. We recognized that talent and picked him in 5th grade. Over his first season he rose through each grade and played 6 rounds in seconds. Also playing PG for the full season, always as a dashing, stylish batsmen and a wonderful and athletic cover fieldsman. It is my absolute privilege to stand up and recognize someone who has given an enormous amount to this Club over a very long period.

Peter's statistics for the club...over 90 innings for the club & accumulating 2130 runs at an average of 25.06. Springa will attest his was radically under bowled as a leg spinner and took 8 wickets across his time at UNSWCC at a significant cost / average.

By 1987 he was an established first grader averaging 30 in first and second grades. I have used pictures to describe the enigma that is Peter Springa Scolari.

The first photo (below left) is a picture on the 1988 Tour to UK Ireland and Wales. It signifies his love of the camaraderie with his fellow tourists and his enjoyment of a good beverage.

Springa was playing for Hythe CC in Kent in 1988 and 1989 and was a welcome club professional and grounds man at a lovely club on the English Channel.

A great tourist on the above tour, he was a fresh faced, reserved young man, but always with a funny line to make light of situations to maximise enjoyment & fun.



The second photo shows Peter as a player, sadly near the end of his playing days in an Old Boys game. I was lucky to have played a lot in 2nds with Springa & on many tours. I was also very happy he joined and completed our later tours to the UK in 2023 and 2025, representing UNSWCC with skill & enjoyment. On these tours he showed he still is a beautiful batsman, was a good fieldsman and could bowl when you needed the other team to declare.

Springa is a great competitor but made playing cricket joyous and fun. He was always joking, finding the funny side in game situations & always had a beer after the game. Springa also put the "Whey" into the UNSWCC lexicon.

Now the 3rd photo is of Peter being awarded the UNSW Sports Recognition award in 2022. This was awarded to services to the cricket club.



Peter left UNSWCC and Australia in 1991 and went to Ireland for a couple of years, then returned home to Dubbo. He met Lara and raised a cracking family (3 wonderful boys), plus built a thriving accountancy business.

Our good fortune was Lara won an art fellowship in Sydney, so the family moved to Sydney and with our Treasurer position vacant with the retirement of Jim Dixon, Springa took on the role of Treasurer in 2009. He maintained that role until 2026, a period of 17 years.

During these 17 years Peter has provided guidance, financial advice, leadership in times when the work and strain on sporting clubs is only increasing. So, thanks for those many years of hard work and toil. We all owe him great debt. He has fulfilled the task being on the club Executive with distinction and excellence.

Most know Springa loves a funny story...he always responds on group conversation providing anecdotes of his life on the farm at Peak Hill, about tours and life in general.

In helping manage this 75th dinner and finding out those attending, he replied... "Brilliant! What a crew we have coming. More Legends than a Honda car yard! We are so lucky to have been part of this club – but everyone knew this any way!"

This is a very well-deserved Life Membership, and I am very proud to award it to Peter Scolari for exemplary services to UNSWCC on and off the field over many years.....

Life Member Induction – Michael John Gregg

Tonight, on our 75th anniversary, it's my absolute privilege to stand up and recognise someone who has given an enormous amount to this Club over a very long period.

And in Mike Gregg's case - we're literally talking about decades. Gregg started with UNSW in the 1983/84 season... it wasn't exactly a fairytale debut — he made 1 run and got no wickets. From an underwhelming start he went on to build a great career that included — 21 season and 215 matches across 2nd to 6th grade over 24 years

His batting - we won't dwell on too much 162 innings 899 runs at an average of 7.68 which did include an impressive 45 not outs. He summed up his own batting beautifully in one of his captains' reports, saying: "Shows some ability with the bat... although having only one shot is a limitation"

But it was with the ball Mike really made his mark, bowling finger spinning leggies and earning the nickname "fingers". In another captain's report from 1992/93 he wrote "One of the young players in the team did not realise I bowled leggies until Round 12. Young guys can be cruel"

His contribution with the ball is impressive - 3,470 overs, 840 maidens, 390 wickets at 23. Eight five-wicket hauls, with best bowling figures including 7 for 40 and 7 for 54, and a standout season in 86/87 where he took 50 wickets at 14.

Mike also captained teams across multiple seasons including a grand final loss in 4th Grade in 94/95.

In 1994/95 Mike won the coveted Barr Turn Jacket. Now I've reached out to my "go to" team for Club information (Jebby, Starky, AJ) as to why Mike won it, and they have all let me down. Club records show Phelspy gave it to him, so we asked Phelspy who relied "I gave it to Gainsy" — That was helpful as Gainsy never actually never got it! Maybe, if it's appropriate for this crowd, Mike can fill us all in later.

Off the field during his playing days, Mike's contribution was just as strong. One of my first memories of Mike was as the editor of the literary masterpiece the Saturday Sledge. He took on this role from 1987 to 1995, which was no small undertaking before passing it onto another Club legend in Jebby. Those currently copied in on the GG Grundler newsletters will attest to Mike's literary brilliance.

He toured South America in early 90's and the UK in 2000 with Club tours, along with various country tours. Having been born in Argentina, he was lucky to get out of South America without having to complete National Service!

But it's Mike's more recent contributions that really highlight what this Club means to him. When we lost Village Green and David Phillips North, a lot of people were frustrated. Mike wasn't just frustrated — he got mobilized!

Online petitions, lobbying, leveraging contacts within UNSW and agitating wherever he could to make sure cricket at UNSW didn't just quietly disappear.

And then, in typical Mike fashion, he calls me in around 2023 and says “Let’s catch up — I want to do something for the Club, how can I help” At that point, we had only the one ground that is barely 1st Grade standard...and a university that didn’t seem overly concerned whether cricket survived or not. Some of the more cynical of us might say, it actually had a desire to ensure it didn’t.

That catch up with Milke — and the financial support that followed — quite literally saved the Club from what would have almost certainly been a very slow and painful death. Luckily, with this financial security, some personnel changes at UNSW Sport and Lenny and others hard work at repairing the relationship with the Uni, the Club is now successfully rebuilding and slowly getting back into a strong position to thrive.

And if all that wasn’t enough...I get another call a year or so ago “Colonel — I’m buying a property at Richmond... I want to build the Club a cricket ground.” This one floored me a little but once I realized he was serious, the discussions have progressed. This dream is getting closer to becoming a reality. A fair bit of work has already been done by Jimmy Wilcher and Jebby and

whilst there are still a few hurdles to jump, we are getting closer to The VG2.0 becoming a reality.

Mike is definitely a Bee for life. He has 50+ horses running around all over the world in Bumblebee colored silks, one of them is called Barr Turn that races in horizontal stripes and talk of a future horse to be named Livo, it is abundantly clear what the club means to Mike.

Before I finish, it would be remiss not to acknowledge Sue and Mikes family. The time, energy, and support Mike, Sue and the whole Gregg family have given this Club over so many years doesn’t happen without Sue’s support - and more importantly, permission.

Mike — you’ve been a player, a captain, a contributor off the field, a supporter, and more recently a lifeline to keep us alive. Without you... there’s a very good chance none of us are sitting here tonight.

It is with enormous pleasure that I welcome you as a Life Member of the greatest Cricket Club there is.

Tribute – Christopher Tremain

"There was movement at the station, for the word had passed around that the colt from Old Regret had got away - And had joined the wild bush horses – he was worth a thousand pounds, so all the cracks had gathered to the fray" A.B. "Banjo" Paterson



It wasn't quite *The Man from Snowy River*, and I'm no crack rider. Contrary to advice, I fell off a horse once and never got back on. I was, however, a new Club President, and like all Club Presidents across Sydney Grade Cricket, was wondering how to improve our list.

Suddenly, a whisper – the word had passed around, but to me first! It was 2009 and former Bee, Andrew Zell, Gilgandran cricketer and canny day-trader, called to say, "I think I've found a good one". Zelly suggested I pop up to the SCEGS Playing Fields at Northbridge, a living memorial to the many Shore boys who have served and died in war.

The stakes weren't so high that day, but NSW Combined Independent Schools were contesting the annual NSW Schools tournament. Zelly's Central West mail was that a quick from Kinross Wolaroi was worth a chat. The quick was Chris Tremain. He was worth a chat indeed.

I introduced myself and asked a 17-year-old Trem if he'd be interested in playing for UNSWCC when he finished school and came to Sydney. He said, "Sounds good!" and we chatted about other things. "That was easy", I thought. And it was. When I asked later why he joined us, he said "You were the first ones to ask". And that was that.

Trem was a charming young man, with good manners and the gift of the gab. And he was loyal from the get-go, a quality inherent to good clubmen and great people. None of this has changed. What has changed is Trem's place in the cricket world. He retires as one of the greats of the club, and of modern domestic cricket.

It took an extra year to get Trem to Sydney because in the 2009-10 pre-season he busted his shoulder doing something loose. Pig-shooting maybe. Or motorbike riding. Or playing rugby. Something manly, something country. Classic Trem. Fast forward a year and he's rocking up to training at the Village Green. Murray Creed was Head Coach, and I'd asked Muz and the boys to look after him.

When I called to see how the first session went, Muz said (insert your best Port Elizabeth accent here) "Jonesy, that bloke's actually pretty good!" Muz, why did you sound surprised?! Nevertheless, Trem was picked in Second Grade. It was the last Saturday in September 2010, and St Kilda was busy drawing a Grand Final against Collingwood, the closest they'd been (and would go) for years. I was at a buck's event at the Greengate Hotel, Killara, again anxiously awaiting word of the "colt", Tremain.

Danny Bhandari called – or, more likely, I called Bandit – and his feedback was of the "good news, bad news" variety. "The good news, Jonesy, is he took 7-fa and won us the game. "The bad news is he nearly

killed 3 batsmen and Sydney CC wants him out of Second Grade immediately!" Perhaps I exaggerate, but not by much. He was fast, he moved the ball and he was way too good for that level. 14 wickets in 3 games saw him promoted to First Grade. By the end of next season, he was playing for NSW. The word had passed around.

In those days (and probably still), Cricket NSW had Grade Cricket Advisors, old salts who recognised talent when they saw it. A bush telegraph but in the city. Their job was to report new finds to CNSW after the most recent round. Trem impressed a couple two weeks in a row in 2011-12. From (fading) memory, NSW all-rounder and First Grade Legend Grant Lambert at Fairfield, and Bill Anderson, veteran coach at Randy-Petes. To paraphrase the Matchbox 20 album title "Them or someone like them".

Trem debuted for the Blues in a February 2012 one-day at the WACA, knocking over Travis Birt and Luke Ronchi, both future internationals. Birt was LBW – the off-cutter? – and Ronchi was caught behind – perhaps the one that holds its line or nips away. Trem made a career of those deliveries. A Shield debut was not too far away.

In March 2012 I had one of the honors of my life presenting Trem with his Baggy Blue at the MCG. Sure, I was working across the road at Cricket Australia and there was no-one else available, but I appreciated the gesture! Dawso was playing too, so it was super-special as a Bees man. Sadly, Trem later saw fit to award me the Barr-Turn for my presentation speech, because I implied, correctly, that Dawso was the ultimate professional and he was a little loose!

But there was nothing loose about his bowling: his debut victims were Chris Rogers, Peter Handscomb, Cameron White, Glenn Maxwell and Aaron Finch (twice). All modern Victorian greats. The Vics clearly took note because they poached Trem at the end of the 2014 season. NSW coach Trevor Bayliss offered Trem a one-year contract, late. The Vics offered a two-year contract, early. Trem made the obvious and correct decision. Some would argue that the CEO of Cricket NSW – me! – was an idiot to let him go. He was. I knew it was the wrong decision. But as a CEO

in sport, you can't hire and fire the coach if you also pick their team. I had to respect TB's call – and Vic coach Greg Shipperd's. Trem went to Melbourne.

Trem kept reminding NSW what it had lost, piling up 209 Shield wickets for Victoria and 4 titles in 6 years. His last title was in my last season at Cricket NSW, so I had the grim pleasure of watching Tremain, Boland, Pattinson and Siddle blow us away in the Final. Test spinner Jon Holland was nearly as much of a spectator at the Junction as I was.

By that time Trem was married to the wonderful Shannon, a former professional ballerina, but the opposite of a prima donna. She kept Trem on the straight and narrow. Mostly. Happily, despite my MCG speech indiscretion, Trem asked me to MC their wedding in 2017 – another great honor. Met with another cavalier performance!

Breakfast with Scott Boland the next day is a fond memory. Barrel and Trem were close on and off the field and contributed significantly to each other's success. A quiet dinner in Hawthorn a year or two later – Cricket NSW paid! – planted the seed of Trem's return to the Blues, which he did in mid-2020. NSW did him wrong, but it had grandparents nearby!



First son Noah was born in 2019 and Hugo followed in 2021. Trem's folks Peter and Helen continued to make trips down from Yeoval to babysit Noah, as they had 2010-2014 to babysit Trem! Great people, and a lot of fun.

Meanwhile, country boy Trem unexpectedly became a Gentleman of Bronte. Turns out Shannon's Dad, also Chris (Shannon, discuss!), had a successful business career, and he and Shan's Mum, Jenny, bought a house by the beach when they still cost

roughly \$5. Smart people! So, Trem and Shan live downstairs at Chateau Bronte, the Robinsons/babysitters live upstairs – a perfect set-up for the parents of young kids and their grandparents.

Having brought Trem back though, the Blues, bemusingly, proceeded not to pick him. Their key signing! Their tormentor! For a whole year! It was Covid time, but that disease affects lungs, not brains. Allegedly.



Anyway, fast forward to November 2021 and we are golfing at Bonnie Doon. Even Trem – a relentless optimist – was close to giving up on his career. He

had finally been picked for a Shield game, but it was nearly cancelled when Will Sutherland caught Covid. Trem thought he was doomed.

Luckily no other player tested positive, and the game proceeded with a day's delay. Trem took a wicket first ball of this second NSW debut, and another wicket two balls later. Fittingly it was Peter Handscomb, as it was years earlier. Matt Short followed next over, Trem had 3-2 and he was away. He took 24 wickets in 5 matches that season, and another 24 the following year. 2023-24 was even better: Trem took 50 wickets in a Shield season, only the 4th NSW bowler to do so, and won the Steve Waugh Medal as NSW Player of the Year.

I cried when I heard the news. I cried because I am so proud of Trem. He's a great bloke, a loyal friend and a Hall of Fame Bee. Like the poem, he came to UNSWCC a colt from the bush, and then he got away. Unlike the poem, he returned home by choice. He is also worth more than "a thousand pounds". A lot more. He is priceless.

Well played Trem. Thanks for everything.

History & Origins of Awards

Forward by Darren Sue - Honorary Statistician & Record Keeper

E.H. "Ted" Davis Award for Player of The Year

The E.H. "Ted" Davis Award (originally named "All-Rounder" of the Year) was first presented in 1968. Edward H. Davis (known as Ted) was the UNSW Registrar and club Patron from 1967 to 1972 (taking over from G.L. Macauley - another notorious figure in UNSWCC history) Ted did an enormous amount of work behind the scenes during the club's application for entry into the Sydney Grade Competition to raise the profile of the UNSWCC.

W. John Rogers Award for Poidevin-Gray Shield (U21) Player of The Year



The W. John Rogers Award was first awarded in 1983. William J. Rogers (known as John) was a former St. George and NSW State batsmen who joined the club in 1975/1976, although his initial association can be traced back to his days as a student at UNSW in the 1960s where he played in some very successful Inter-Varsity sides. His dedication over the following seasons as an extremely skilled, inventive and intuitive 1st Grade Captain, an outstanding mentor to all players in the club, along with his innate energy assisted and directed the club through the tough years of transition into the Sydney Grade Competition. Ultimately, his influence led the club to its first big successes in Graded Cricket – in the form of a 1st Grade

and Poidevin-Gray premiership in 1976/1977 (5th Grade were also finalists that season), a 2nd Grade premiership in 1977/1978, and then to arguably the club's most outstanding achievement, a Club Championship in 1978/1979. As a consummate professional, John left the club after 1978/1979 to pursue a role as a NSW State Selector (for only two games!), then moved to WA to take the role as General Manager for the WACA. JR is the Father of Australian opening batsman Chris Rogers and was awarded Life Membership to UNSWCC 1982.

Michael J. "MOB" O'Brien Shield for A.W. Green Shield (U16) Player of the Year



The A.W. Green Shield Player of the year was instituted upon the Club's inception into the Green Shield competition in 1997/1998. In 2018/2019, the Club's general committee saw it only just to recognise the invaluable contribution by the late Michael O'Brien and renamed the award after him. Michael J. O'Brien (1953-2018), known as "MOB" to his mates, first came to the UNSWCC in 2005/2006 through the Club's connections with Randwick Juniors (notably his Son Christopher and Stepson Nicholas Bannehr who both played for the club) and at the time filled the much needed post of A.W. Green Shield Team Manager. Over the following 7 seasons, MOB poured his heart and soul into mentoring and developing our junior players and was primarily responsible for creating our Green Shield program and pathway that we have today. MOB's love for the club was obvious, displayed by the fact he would do anything to help, be it jump on a scorebook, assist captains with match day duties – in essence anything to make the UNSWCC a better place. He was also an active member of the Club's social scene, where his trademark Hawaiian shirts were legendary. MOB was nothing if not a straight shooter – be it delivering stern words or supplying a player with some good advice – he would tell you exactly what he thought. But he was a humble and intelligent man at the core, routinely greeting you with a smile and a quip before going about the next task selflessly and totally without ego - he was one of those rare individuals that you could class as an all-round good

bloke. MOB was Awarded UNSWCC Clubman of the year in 2008/2009 and a UNSW SRC in 2010/2011. Thanks, must be given to Mr. Matthew Sanders for donating the perpetual shield marking the renaming of this award.

Captain John C. Morris Fielding Trophy for Fieldsman of the Year

The Captain John Morris Fielding Trophy was first awarded to John Middleton in 1959 (who was arguably the most outstanding cricketer in the first 20 years of the club's history). The late Captain John Morris served in the Indian Army during the days of the Raj. For many years he was Vice President for both the UNSW and Sydney University cricket clubs, in addition also scored for Sydney University for many years. He had a pet theory regarding the importance of fielding in the game of cricket – and would never stop talking about it. Reportedly, he would talk about fielding to anyone who would listen. Skip was awarded Life Membership to UNSWCC in 1960.

The Barr-Turn Jacket (Trophy)

The Barr-Turn Trophy was instituted by the late Clem H. Barrington and A.R. Turner in 1969 and was awarded to the most notorious player of the year for both his on, and off-field performances. Clem Barrington was a wicket keeper who took 137 catches and 68 stumpings over many years during the Shires era of the club, was club President from 1966 to 1976, and was one of the club's primary movers for entry into the Sydney Grade Competition. He was also an engineer on staff at UNSW. Bob Turner bowled left arm orthodox and took 255 wickets during the club's years in Shires. Bob was also on staff at UNSW. Together, they made the first ever Barr-Turn Trophy (a statuette) however, this was disposed of in 1976 by the wife of 70's fast bowler Dick Pym, due to its unsavory, disgusting nature. Many luminaries have won the Barr-Turn - BUT never by those who have tried to win it. Clem was awarded Life Membership to UNSWCC in 1960.

Peter D. Richardson Award for Clubman of the Year



The Clubman of the Year was awarded for the first time in 1976/1977 but was renamed The Peter D. Richardson Award in 2009/2010. The late Peter D. Richardson (1943-2009) joined the club in 1999/2000 when his son, Tim, came to play for UNSWCC. For almost a decade until his sudden passing, Peter immersed himself in the club's unique culture and dedicated himself to its many facets – most notably that of 1st Grade Team Manager and Training Coordinator, for which he travelled from Wollongong at least twice a week during the season to attend.

A devoted family man, he was recognized as a man of dignity, wisdom, humility, wit and was totally reliable, whilst always maintaining his unassuming nature. Peter was a fantastic advocate and representative of UNSWCC and had a profound impact on the ethos and culture of the club – truly one of nature's Gentlemen. His talents as a team manager and advocate were recognized when he was awarded the role of team manager for the SE Sydney State League Representative Team in 2005, and a UNSW SRA in 2007. Peter, who was known as a “cricketing tragic”, early in life had a legendary career with Shires

Club Burwood Briars (with whom he is also a life member) as a grafting opening batsman. He was a prominent member of the Australian Cricket Society and was very well respected in the cricketing community by teammates and opposition alike. Richo was Awarded UNSWCC Clubman of the year in 2001/2002 and became a Life Member of UNSWCC in 2008/2009.

The club this year has showed an operating profit of \$155,361 but please note that this was after a reimbursement from our supporters via our Foundation Account of \$200,000 (2025 \$200,000).

Gross income for the year was \$332,972 (last year \$380,245) and Total Expenses were \$177,610 (last year \$196,019) with decreases in Gear, Net Hire and Repairs this year.

In terms of our balance sheet, we have approximately \$482,000 sitting in bank accounts with all accounts paid as at 30 June 2026.

Once again, I'd like to put in a huge thank you to **Darren "Suey" Sue** for his efforts in chasing subs and forwarding on invoices for payment. Also, to **Matt**



Sanders who always has been a huge help this year with the finances and his assistance with budgeting.

Thank you to Peter Godber and the hardworking Committee and to those who helped celebrate the club's 75th Anniversary.

Finally, thank you to my team at Tribel Accountants for the work they have put in to keep the accounts, GST and invoicing up to date.

Playing Conditions Updates

Grounds

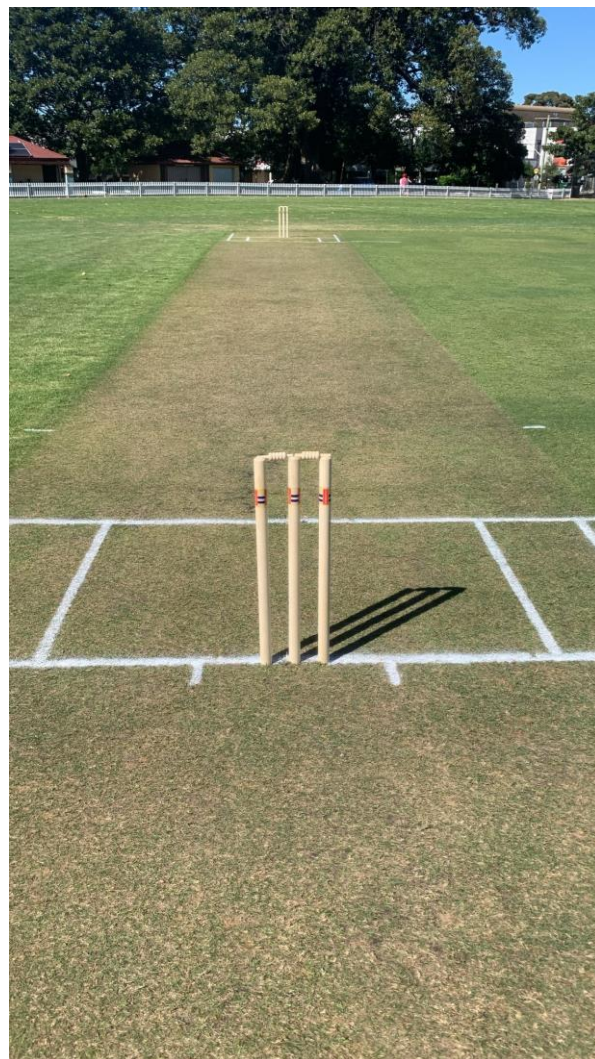

Grants and Funding

In 2025/2026 we were successful in securing the following grants and funding (for detail refer to our financial report):

Coaching

We received the full Cricket NSW Premier Cricket coaching grant, which was approved after consideration of our training facilities, intended coaching program, structure and staffing. This generous support from Cricket NSW is critical to us being able to deliver the coaching setup and excellent staff that we have.

General Cricket NSW Grant

Suey's oversight and co-ordination of our registration, financial reporting, uniform, competition sponsor, Code of Conduct and match day requirements, saw us meet the criteria set by Cricket NSW for Premier Cricket to receive a full general grant.

Cricket Australia (CA) Funding

This assistance is funding from CA based on direct reimbursement for costs associated with approved activities that promote growth in cricket participation. Our qualifying expenditure didn't warrant a maximum claim this season, but Cricket NSW has kindly allowed us to carry over the "shortfall" for additional expenditure next season - so will we look at a few grounds' equipment upgrades (perhaps better covers trolleys at both DP and RA).

ACA Premier Cricket Program

This program assists us in gaining access to ex-first class players and employing them as coaches.

We received the maximum allocation this season, allowing us to engage our beloved Corey (Richards).

UNSW High Performance Club Funding

We received our usual base UNSW funding due to our status as a High Performance Club, with a "top up", linked to the number of student and/or active alumni members that we have. Our social teams, completely made up of students, have improved this number and led to an increase in funding.

A great all-rounder who we will all be watching rise through the ranks. Great blokes to have played at the Club and we hope to welcome you back again in the future.

We saw some terrific improvement in our younger players as they progressed up the grades and played Green Shield and PG's, and it is here that the Club's future looks very bright. Consecutive finals appearances in Green Shield, and with many of our players regularly in our Grade teams have led to improved individual performance and grade progression. This was very much on display in the 4th Grade Grand Final with so many of our young players matching it with our opposition much older and more experienced cricketers. I look forward to watching them continue their journey through the Club into our higher grades next season and beyond.



Once again, this season, it was always a pleasure to watch our teams play on Saturdays across all grades – with the same UNSWCC philosophy. To play hard, to play to win and to enjoy the game and your teammates. COACHING REPORT

UNSWCC had 2 of its 8 teams qualify for finals this season, with 4th Grade progressing to the Grand Final. While this was fewer finals appearances compared to the previous season, the overall year should be viewed as one of growth, development, and long-term progress.

The standout story of the season was 4th Grade. Despite narrowly falling short in the final, the resilience, competitiveness, and togetherness displayed by the group reflected the direction and culture we are continuing to build at UNSWCC. Across the club there were strong signs of progress, particularly through the development of younger players, improved alignment between grades, and stronger buy-in towards training standards and team-first cricket.

Club Championship Overview

UNSWCC finished 14th in the Club Championship standings this season. While results still do not fully reflect where we want to be as a club, there were clear improvements throughout the year, particularly within 1st Grade and 4th Grade. This was my third season in this role, and the focus has remained on rebuilding the club through culture, development, accountability, and long-term sustainability. The current playing group has embraced hard work, opportunity, and growth, which is creating stronger foundations for future success.

A major positive this season was the improvement in cultural alignment and player investment. Younger players transitioning through Green Shield and PGs showed stronger understanding of role clarity, preparation, and expectations within senior cricket. Consistency across all grades remains an area for improvement, however the club is moving in a positive direction.

Grade Analysis

1st Grade – 15th Place

1st Grade showed significant improvement compared to previous seasons, finishing 15th after placing 19th and 17th in the previous two years. The side nearly doubled its wins and competition points, which was a strong indication of progress.

The biggest positive was the development of a young core group who gained valuable experience competing



against strong opposition each week. While the side still struggled at times to post consistently large first-innings totals, the overall competitiveness and belief within the group improved significantly throughout the season.

Krishna Padmanabhan led the side exceptionally well and helped create a strong team environment. The inclusion of experienced players such as Gilkes and Lammonby also had a positive influence on professionalism, preparation, and overall standards.

The next step for this group is improving consistency and learning how to convert competitive performances into winning cricket through stronger role execution and higher individual standards.

2nd Grade – 20th Place

2nd Grade had a disappointing season overall considering the talent available within the squad. On paper, the side had the ability to compete much higher on the ladder, however inconsistency and lack of continuity impacted performances throughout the year.

Frequent movement between 1st and 2nd Grade made it difficult for combinations and roles to settle. Injuries and availability also contributed to instability within the playing group.

Moving forward, the group needs greater consistency with batting performances, stronger game awareness in key moments, and improved continuity within the side.

3rd Grade – 8th Place

3rd Grade had a very strong season overall and narrowly missed finals after losing crucial moments late in the year.

The side competed extremely hard throughout the season and built a positive, resilient environment under the leadership of Rohan Indap. One of the biggest strengths of the group was its ability to contribute collectively rather than relying heavily on individuals.

Although missing finals was disappointing, the overall trajectory of the group was highly encouraging and there is a strong base to continue building from moving forward.

4th Grade – 1st Place (Minor Premiers)

4th Grade were the standout side of the club this season. Finishing first and progressing to the Grand Final with such a young squad was an outstanding achievement and reflected the culture and competitiveness within the group. The team consistently played fearless, energetic, and team-first cricket throughout the season. Despite being one of the youngest teams in the competition, they continually embraced pressure situations and competed until the final ball.

Sam Hayes did an exceptional job leading the side. His tactical understanding, calmness under pressure, and leadership maturity were major strengths throughout the season. Senior players such as Bandit and Chai also provided valuable experience and support around the younger core group.

Although the Grand Final result was disappointing, the experience gained by this group will be invaluable for the long-term future of the club.

5th Grade – 12th Place

5th Grade experienced an inconsistent season overall; however, performances improved significantly during the second half of the year.

The side contained several younger Green Shield players transitioning into senior cricket, which naturally created periods of inconsistency as players adjusted to the physical and mental demands of grade cricket.

Oscar Howard led strongly when available and brought a calm and fearless approach both as a player and leader. Unfortunately, injuries and availability issues impacted the continuity and balance of the side throughout the season.

Despite the ladder position, there were strong signs of improvement late in the year, with several younger players developing significantly and the overall competitiveness of the side increasing.

6th Grade – 9th Place

6th Grade narrowly missed finals and should be proud of the progress made throughout the season. The side largely consisted of younger players gaining their first exposure to senior cricket and the growth shown throughout the year was extremely positive. The team consistently competed hard and improved significantly as the season progressed. The biggest positive was the development of younger players and the culture that was created within the group. While missing finals was disappointing, the season provided an important platform for future growth within the club.

Captain Analysis

Krishna Padmanabhan – 1st Grade

Krishna showed excellent leadership, professionalism, and care throughout the season. Leading a young and relatively inexperienced 1st Grade side required significant emotional investment and he consistently ensured players were mentally and physically prepared each week.

One of Krishna's biggest strengths was his communication and connection with players. He regularly checked in with teammates after matches and training sessions and created an environment where players felt supported and valued.

From a tactical perspective, Krishna continued to improve throughout the season and his understanding of managing momentum and pressure situations developed strongly. His batting performances were also a major positive and he consistently led from the front during difficult periods.

Krishna has developed significantly as both a leader and senior player and will continue to be an important figure within the club moving forward.

Aaron Crofts – 2nd Grade

Aaron brought passion, competitiveness, and accountability to 2nd Grade throughout the season. He consistently drove standards within the group and challenged players to improve individually and collectively. Aaron's leadership style is direct and demanding, however it comes from a genuine desire to see players reach their potential. He never expected anything from players that he was not willing to demand from himself.

One of the major challenges Aaron faced this season was the constant movement of players between grades, which made continuity difficult throughout the year. Despite these challenges, he maintained strong expectations and competitiveness within the side and continued to push standards across the group.

Rohan Indap – 3rd Grade

Rohan led 3rd Grade with passion, resilience, and strong competitiveness throughout the season. One of his greatest strengths was his ability to maintain energy and positivity within the group, particularly during difficult periods of matches. He consistently motivated players and created an environment where the team remained connected and competitive. The players responded strongly to his leadership and commitment throughout the season and the overall culture within the side was extremely positive.

Sam Hayes – 4th Grade

Sam had an outstanding season as captain, leading a very young side to a Grand Final at just 17 years of age.

His tactical understanding of the game, composure under pressure, and confidence in decision-making were major strengths throughout the season. Importantly, he also led strongly through his professionalism and actions, which earned the respect of the entire group.

Sam has significant leadership potential moving forward and this season will be invaluable for his long-term development both as a player and leader.

Oscar Howard – 5th Grade

Oscar quietly had a strong impact on 5th Grade throughout the season. While not the loudest personality, he consistently led through actions, competitiveness, and calmness under pressure. His fearless batting approach often set the tone for the side, and he communicated particularly well with younger players transitioning into senior cricket. Unfortunately, injuries impacted his availability throughout the season, however his leadership and experience remained valuable whenever he played.

Max Christensen – 6th Grade

Max brought outstanding energy, enthusiasm, and accountability to 6th Grade throughout the season. With such a young side, he played an important role in helping players understand expectations around preparation, attitude, and professionalism. His competitiveness and positivity helped establish a strong team culture throughout the year. The players responded strongly to his leadership style and the overall environment within the group was a major positive for the club.

Individual Analysis

Several players made significant improvements throughout the season and represent the future strength of the club.

Nirav Sharma was one of the standout performers across the club. Scoring 633 runs while also taking 17 wickets highlighted his quality as a genuine all-round player. Beyond the statistics, his maturity, work ethic, and willingness to continually learn were major positives throughout the season.

Yug Chaudari had a remarkable year taking 43 wickets as a young left-arm spinner. His ability to consistently spin the ball, compete under pressure, and improve his overall athleticism throughout the year showed enormous potential for future higher honours.

Gus Cassim continued his development with over 500 runs and several important innings throughout the season. His unique batting style, athleticism in the field, and competitiveness make him an extremely exciting long-term prospect for the club.

Hirav Gandhi played an important role in the success of 4th Grade, consistently contributing with both bat

and ball in crucial moments. His composure under pressure and ability to impact games made him one of the most reliable performers within the side.

Shrisai Chandrasekar - brought enormous energy and X-factor throughout the season. His ability to influence games with bat, ball, and fielding was a major reason behind 4th Grade's success, particularly his ability to take early wickets and shift momentum.

Zachary Nicholls represented everything the club values through his determination, resilience, and selfless attitude. He consistently delivered in important moments and set a strong example through his competitiveness and commitment to the team.

Recruitment & Talent Pathways

The club took a more development-focused recruitment approach this season, placing greater emphasis on promoting players through the existing pathway system rather than heavily targeting external recruitment.

The Green Shield and PGs programs, led by **Tarik Viswasam** and **Aaron Crofts**, continue to play a major role in strengthening the club's future talent pool.

Several players have emerged as exciting long-term prospects including:

- Nirav Sharma
- Yug Chaudari
- Ariyan Banker
- Chris Harris
- Lucas Camin
- Gus Cassim

The strongest positive from the pathway system has been the improved alignment between junior and senior cricket standards, expectations, and culture. Strong retention across the playing group was also a major positive this season. Maintaining continuity within younger squads is extremely important for long-term development and allows stronger relationships and role clarity to continue building across grades.

Coaching & Selection

One of the biggest personal learnings as Coaching Director was gaining a clearer understanding of the type of environment and culture required to continue moving the club forward. This season also helped me grow significantly as a coach and gain a clearer understanding of the standards and environment required to move the club forward. One of my biggest strengths is building relationships and communicating with players, however I also learnt that to continue improving as a club, there are moments where I need to be stronger and more demanding with expectations and accountability. I believe the players respect honesty and clear standards and moving forward I want to continue creating an environment where

players are challenged, held accountable, and pushed to reach a higher level both individually and collectively.

The coaching philosophy throughout the season centred around:

- Work ethic and accountability
- Team-first cricket
- Role clarity
- Growth mindset and continuous learning
- Training with purpose and intensity

The club took a progressive approach to player development, particularly through exposing younger players to higher grades and greater responsibility. While this naturally created inconsistency at times, it was important for the long-term growth and sustainability of the club.

Selection throughout the season focused on:

- Performance
- Role execution
- Training standards
- Attitude and professionalism
- Team contribution

One of the biggest lessons from the season was recognising the need for stronger leadership structures and greater accountability across both players and staff. Moving forward, there are already positive plans in place to strengthen the structure further through increased specialist coaching support, stronger player leadership, and clearer responsibilities across the program.

Coaching Program

The coaching structure throughout the season was a major strength of the club and several individuals played important roles in player development and culture.

Corey Richards continued to have a major impact through his tactical understanding, leadership, and mentorship of both players and coaches. His experience and calm approach consistently challenged players to think deeper about the game and improve their understanding of pressure situations and match strategy.

Tarik Viswasam did an outstanding job across Green Shield, PGs, and the fielding program. His energy, passion, and connection with younger players were extremely valuable and he continued to grow strongly as a coach throughout the season.

Chris Tremain and **David Freeman** also brought valuable specialist knowledge and experience into the environment. Their work with fast bowlers and spin bowlers respectively added another layer of

professionalism and technical development within the program.

Some of the major positives from the coaching program included:

- Improved player buy-in
- Stronger communication between grades
- Increased development of younger players
- Better alignment between pathway and senior cricket
- A more positive feedback culture
- Higher standards at training

While there were still challenges around coaching availability, logistics, and consistency across all grades, the overall direction of the coaching structure continues to move positively.

Pre-Season & Training Analysis



The club adopted a stronger focus on fitness, professionalism, and preparation throughout pre-season.

Stuart McKay played an important role leading the fitness program and improving overall player engagement and standards. The attendance and buy-in towards fitness sessions was significantly stronger than previous seasons and players benefited greatly from the structure and professionalism he brought into the environment.

The Brisbane pre-season trip also provided valuable match exposure, team bonding, and opportunities to assess combinations heading into the season. While

several players were overseas at the time, the experience was highly beneficial both on and off the field.

Training attendance improved significantly during the first half of the season compared to previous years. There was noticeably stronger buy-in from players and a greater commitment towards preparation and standards across the club.

However, attendance and consistency dropped after Christmas, which was disappointing and highlighted the need for continued accountability and stronger leadership from players throughout the season. Maintaining standards during difficult periods remains an important area for improvement moving forward.

The teams and players who consistently trained with intensity and purpose generally performed better throughout the season, reinforcing the importance of preparation and professionalism.

Training facilities improved significantly this season due to the outstanding work of Cam Baird in preparing wickets and managing facilities despite difficult weather conditions throughout the year.

One of the key recommendations moving forward is the installation of covers for training wickets. This would significantly improve preparation quality, training consistency, and overall professionalism across the club, particularly during periods of poor weather.

Summary

Overall, the 2025/26 season should be viewed as a season of growth, learning, and strong long-term progression for UNSWCC. While results across all grades did not consistently reflect where we ultimately want to be as a club, there were significant positives throughout the season. The development of younger

players improved cultural alignment, stronger pathway integration, and the emergence of several future senior players all highlight that the club is moving in the right direction.

The standout achievement of the season was the success of 4th Grade and the continued growth of the club's younger playing group. More importantly, the attitudes, competitiveness, and buy-in shown by players across the club reflected the standards and culture we are continuing to build.

There are still areas requiring improvement, particularly around consistency, leadership accountability, training standards during difficult periods, and converting competitive performances into winning cricket games! However, the foundations within the club are significantly stronger than in previous seasons.

With stronger continuity across the playing group, increased specialist coaching support, and continued investment into pathways and player development, the club is well positioned to continue progressing over the coming seasons.

The focus moving forward remains clear:

- Build stronger standards
- Continue developing our younger core
- Create greater accountability across all grades
- Improve consistency in performances
- Improve coaching structure
- Establish UNSWCC as a highly competitive and sustainable club across all levels

The future of the club is extremely promising and there is genuine belief that the current playing group and coaching structure can continue building something strong and sustainable for years to come.

JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT REPORT

The 2025/2026 season was another significant step forward for the junior development pathway at UNSW Cricket Club. More importantly than results alone, it reinforced that we are building something genuinely special within our program; a connected, aligned and ambitious environment that is beginning to establish a long-term blueprint for sustained success.

Our strategy continues to evolve in spades. The emphasis remains simple: build connection, integrate juniors into senior cricket environments, and create a culture where young players learn what it means to represent this club. That philosophy is now beginning to bear fruit across every level of the pathway.

A major highlight once again was another successful and fulfilling A.W. Green Shield campaign. Our Green Shield group played with hunger, confidence and belief throughout the season, embodying the standards and identity we continue to drive within our junior system. We finished 7th through the regular fixtures and earned a spot in a Quarterfinal which unfortunately was abandoned due to rain.

The performances throughout the campaign were outstanding. From centuries by **Aryan Banker** and **Chris Harris**, to the ever-reliable contributions of our country representatives **Thomas Craig** and **Joe Cameron**, the depth and resilience of this group was evident throughout the season. Leading the side brilliantly was UNSWCC Player of the Year and Green Shield captain **Nirav Sharma**, whose competitiveness and presence made him a handful in every contest. Equally impressive was **Lucas Camin**, whose aggressive and uncompromising approach saw him deservedly claim our Green Shield Player of the Year award. Lucas competed with a toughness and edge that set the tone for the group all season.

While the Under 21's campaign proved challenging from a results perspective, it was arguably one of the most important developmental seasons we have had in recent years. process. His creativity, experience and calm, wise approach continue to add enormous value to our developmental framework. Tim remains a key figure in the continued growth and success of our junior pathway.

Another important pillar in our development has been the strengthening of our connection with Newcastle City Cricket Club. These relationships continue to broaden opportunities for our young players while enhancing the culture and alignment of our wider program.

Off the field, one of the standout moments of the season was our pre-season golf session at Moore Park Golf. It was a fantastic initiative that brought players together in a relaxed environment and further reinforced the importance of connection within our

group. These moments continue to shape the identity of our program and strengthen the bonds between players, coaches and families.

Finally, we would like to sincerely thank the incredible parents and families who continue to support this journey. Without your commitment, trust and involvement, none of this is possible. Your support remains one of the driving forces behind the culture we are creating at this club.

Looking ahead, the future of junior cricket at UNSWCC is ominously exciting. We firmly believe we are building a blueprint that can become engrained in UNSWCC folklore for years to come, an environment built on connection, accountability, opportunity and pride in representing the Bumblebee cap.

CLUB CAPTAINS REPORT

The 2025/26 season was a positive one for the UNSW Bees in terms of social culture, camaraderie, and participation across the club. Throughout the year, we adapted to several challenges and explored new strategies to accommodate the evolving landscape of UNSW Cricket, while still maintaining many of the traditions that make the club special.

Players and Coaches

It was encouraging to see younger players actively seeking advice and engaging with senior members of the club.



Additionally, Kavy and Mahsen volunteered to assist Will Calov with the club's social media throughout the season. This demonstrated the willingness of players to become proactive contributors to the operations and ongoing development of UNSW Cricket, both on and off the field.

Social Events

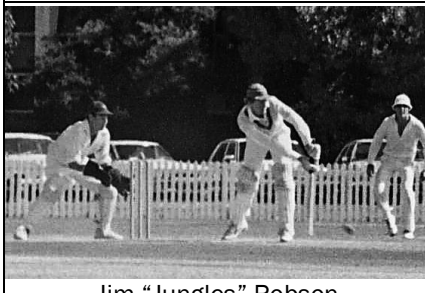

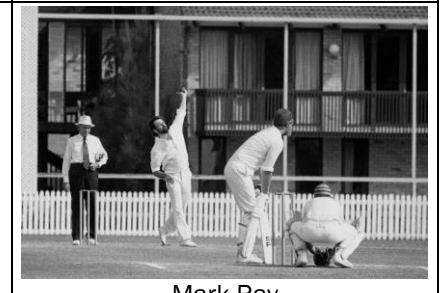

FIRST GRADE REPORT

That culminated this year in a Fourth Grade Grand Final appearance.

First Grade started the year with the Kingsgrove T20 Competition, where we welcomed back **Charlie Wakim** and **Nivethan Radhakrishnan** from Tasmania. We also saw T20 debuts for **Vishwas Saini**, **Nikethan Radhakrishnan** and **Nikhil Thokala**.

We opened the campaign with a morning win against Mosman, before being outplayed by a strong Bankstown batting performance in the afternoon. We then took on North Sydney and put together a compelling team performance before going down to Manly the following week, which unfortunately ended our run. Some notable highlights from the campaign included **Charlie Wakim’s** impressive top-order batting, **Nivethan Radhakrishnan’s** crafty spin bowling, and **Declan Whites’** consistency with the ball.

We began the regular competition against Manly at home, where strong batting performances from **Annay Chauhan** and **Nihal Desai** helped us post a defendable 250. Unfortunately, we went down late after a measured century from Joel Davies, but the collective batting effort provided plenty of optimism for the season ahead. Belief in our batting was something we had lacked in previous campaigns, and this felt like an important step forward.

Next up was Gordon away, where Annay and Nihal again excelled with the bat, supported by a finishing masterclass from **Mahsen Narvel** that helped us post another strong total. Quality spin bowling from Nihal and **Blayne Burke** (on his First Grade debut), along with the experience of Declan White, helped us secure an important white-ball win.

We then quickly shifted to red-ball cricket with a home fixture against Hawkesbury. An outstanding century



from **Annay Chauhan** was the standout as we posted 252 in the first innings. However, some exceptional pace bowling from **Declan White** (5/50) restricted Hawkesbury to 160 and moved us to 2-1 to start the season.

After a narrow loss to Bankstown, Round 4 against Fairfield-Liverpool at Rosedale marked the arrival of **Tom Lammonby** from Somerset. Tom immediately impressed the Bees community, producing a magnificent 176* that showcased his quality, determination and range of strokes, helping us to 380. He was well supported again by **Annay Chauhan**, who made 95 to continue his spectacular start to the season. Unfortunately, bad weather impacted the second innings and the points were shared.

The final red-ball game of that opening stretch brought a great win against Sydney at home, where **Tom Gibson** and **Nikhil Thokala** both claimed maiden five-wicket hauls with some clinical fast bowling. **Mahsen Narvel** also notched his second score in the 70s in three games, producing another gritty middle-order innings after transitioning into a new role this season following time spent opening earlier in the year.

We then had four one-day matches to finish the calendar year, beginning with an incredible win against reigning premiers Parramatta at Kings. We saw a maiden century from 16-year-old **Neel Patel**, who combined with **Matt Gilkes** for a 200-plus partnership. Neel has gone from strength to strength this season, showcasing his top-order class in several matches. We’re excited to be part of his journey and to watch his rapid development continue.

Unfortunately, we lost the next three games, but we entered 2026 optimistic about what was to come.

It was impressive that our only loss in 2026 came in the final round against Eastern Suburbs, where we had four key players unavailable. We had built a team that believed in one another and knew we had the quality to compete with the best.

I think my favourite moment of the season was our win against Wests, who had a powerhouse side that won the Kingsgrove T20 competition earlier in the year. On a tricky wicket, we once again saw the class of **Tom Lammonby**, who produced an all-time performance – scoring 165*, taking 2/49 and holding three match-winning catches. He was also supported by Nikhil, with the pair putting together an 80-plus last-wicket partnership before a complete bowling and fielding performance got us over the line.

This season also saw the emergence of talents such as **Neel Patel**, **Mahsen Narvel** and **Nikhil Thokala**, all of whom benefitted from being around the squad and receiving opportunities last season. We also handed debuts to **Vishwas Saini**, **Blayde Burke**, **Nikethan Radhakrishnan**, **Tom Lammonby** and **Nirav Prasan**, all of whom contributed when given their opportunities.

I'm really excited for this group to stay together and continue building on what we've been putting in place off the field. I'm confident we have the right environment, support staff and program to steer this club towards long-term success. Stepping into new coaching roles is never easy, particularly during a challenging campaign, but both remained committed to rallying and inspiring the boys each week while continuing to push standards and foster growth within the group. Their passion, energy, and investment in the players never wavered.

Thank you also to **Glen Greenberg** and **Punit Patel** for everything they contributed throughout the season to ensure games ran smoothly. Glen's presence around the group, his calm insights, and his ability to create an environment that was both relaxed and accountable played an important role in keeping the squad connected and motivated during difficult periods.

While the season did not deliver the results we hoped for, it laid important foundations for the future. The lessons learned, experience gained, and growth shown across the six rounds will serve this young group well moving forward. I urge everyone who played this year to think about how they will approach PGs next year during this off season. We have the talent to go deep in this comp but that will only happen if players have belief and come with the attitude of putting everything on the line for the sake of the team.

Notes to the Financial Statements

1. Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

The directors have determined that the company is not a reporting entity and accordingly, this financial report is a special purpose report prepared for the sole purpose of distributing a financial report to members and must not be used for any other purpose. The directors have determined that the accounting policies adopted are appropriate to meet the needs of the members.

The financial report has been prepared on an accrual basis and under the historical cost convention, except for certain assets, which, as noted, have been written down to fair value as a result of impairment. Unless otherwise stated, the accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the prior year.

The accounting policies that have been adopted in the preparation of the statements are as follows:

Income Tax

The income tax expense for the year comprises current income tax expense. The company does not apply deferred tax. Current income tax expense charged to the profit or loss is the tax payable on taxable income calculated using applicable income tax rates enacted, or substantially enacted, as at 30 June 2026. Current tax liabilities are therefore measured at the amounts expected to be paid to the relevant taxation authority.

Inventories

Inventories are carried at the lower of cost or net realisable value. Cost is based on the first-in, first out method and includes expenditure incurred in acquiring the inventories and bringing them to the existing condition and location.

Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment is initially recorded at the cost of acquisition or fair value less, if applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. Plant and equipment that has been contributed at no cost, or for nominal cost, is valued and recognised at the fair value of the asset at the date it is acquired. The plant and equipment is reviewed annually by directors to ensure that the carrying amount is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the utilisation of the assets and the subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have been discounted to their present values in estimating recoverable amounts.

Freehold land and buildings are measured at their fair value, based on periodic, but at least triennial, valuations by independent external valuers, less subsequent depreciation for buildings.

Increases in the carrying amount of land and buildings arising on revaluation are credited in equity to a revaluation surplus. Decreases against previous increases of the same asset are charged against fair value reserves in equity. All other decreases are charged to profit or loss.

Any accumulated depreciation at the date of revaluation is offset against the gross carrying amount of the asset and the net amount is restated to the revalued amount of the asset.

Intangibles

Goodwill is recognised as the excess of the purchase price for a business acquired over the fair value of the net assets at the date of acquisition. Goodwill is assessed for impairment annually and is carried at cost less accumulated impairment losses.

Trade and Other Receivables

Trade receivables and other receivables, including distributions receivable, are recognised at the nominal transaction value without taking into account the time value of money. If required a provision for doubtful debt has been created.

Financial Assets

Investments held are originally recognised at cost, which includes transaction costs. They are subsequently measured at fair value which is equivalent to their market bid price at the end of the reporting period. Movements in fair value are recognised through an equity reserve.

Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the company that remain unpaid at 30 June 2026. Trade payables are recognised at their transaction price. They are subject to normal credit terms and do not bear interest.

Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the liability for employee entitlements arising from services rendered by employees to 30 June 2026. Employee benefits have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related costs.

Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the entity has a legal or constructive obligation resulting from past events, for which it is probable that there will be an outflow of economic benefits and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured using the best estimate available of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held on call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts.

Revenue Recognition

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon the delivery of goods to customers.

Revenue from the rendering of services is recognised upon the delivery of the services to customers.

Revenue from commissions is recognised upon delivery of services to customers.

Revenue from interest is recognised using the effective interest rate method.

Revenue from dividends is recognised when the entity has a right to receive the dividend.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Goods and Services Tax

Transactions are recognised net of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the balance sheet.

Leases

Finance leases are leases of fixed assets where substantially all of the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset are transferred to the entity, but the legal ownership is not transferred to the entity.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a corresponding liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased asset, or the minimum lease payments measured at present value including any residual values.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term.

Operating lease payments are charged to the income statement on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease.

Lease incentives are deferred and amortised over the period of the lease.

Profits and losses on sale and leaseback transactions are recognised in the reporting period in which they occur.

Grants

Grant revenue is recognised in the income statement when the entity receives the grant, when it is probable that the entity will receive the economic benefits of the grant and the amount can be reliably measured.

If the grant has conditions attached which must be satisfied before the entity is eligible to receive the grant, the recognition of the revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

Where the entity incurs an obligation to deliver economic value back to the grant contributor, the transaction is considered a reciprocal transaction and the revenue is recognised as a liability in the balance sheet until the required service has been completed, otherwise the income is recognised on receipt.

University of NSW Cricket Club Inc receives non-reciprocal contributions of assets from the government and other parties for a nominal or zero value. These assets are recognised at their fair value on the date of acquisition in the balance sheet, with an equivalent amount of income recognised in the income statement.

Donations and bequests are recognised as revenue when received.

Government Grants

Government grants received are recognised as revenue on a basis to match the recognition of revenue with costs incurred in the project. The design, development and trials extend over a [Insert number of years] year period and revenue from the government grant has been recognised on a straight line basis over that period.
